3 FOR the purpose of updating the repealing a reference to certain fiscal years included in the Maryland Consolidated Transportation Program referencing the transit 4 $\mathbf{5}$ project known as the "Baltimore Corridor Transit Study – Red Line" to continue 6 to apply indefinitely certain provisions of law that specify certain factors that 7the Maryland Transportation Transit Administration, in conducting the transit 8 project, must consider and that prohibit the Administration from acquiring 9 certain real property under certain circumstances; requiring that certain 10 considerations and prohibited acts related to the transit project be applied by the Administration in conjunction with Baltimore City; and generally relating 11 12to the Baltimore Corridor Transit Study.
