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Department of Health and Mental Hygiene – Study of Paratransit Services for Dialysis Patients

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to conduct a certain study of paratransit services provided for dialysis patients in the State; requiring the study to make certain determinations and evaluate scheduling of certain dialysis treatments; requiring the Department to report the findings and any recommendations based on the study to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a study of paratransit services for dialysis patients in the State.

12 Preamble

WHEREAS, The demand for paratransit services has increased significantly in the past 5 years and the primary factor in this increase is attributable to the needs of dialysis patients; and

WHEREAS, State funding for paratransit services in Maryland has not increased for the past 5 years while the cost of providing this service has increased significantly; and

WHEREAS, The circumstances relating to the provision of paratransit services vary between jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, A statewide study of paratransit services offers the best means to identify the need for additional resources as well as opportunities to improve service and reduce costs to better serve the needs of dialysis patients; now, therefore,

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25 MARYLAND, That:



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1	(a)	The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall conduct a study of
2	paratransit	services provided for dialysis patients in the State.

- (b) The study conducted under subsection (a) of this section shall:
- (1) determine the number of dialysis treatments provided each year that require paratransit services, the number of paratransit trips provided each year for dialysis patients, and the number and location of dialysis centers in each jurisdiction in the State;
 - (2) evaluate whether dialysis treatments requiring paratransit services are being scheduled efficiently, including whether dialysis patients are being scheduled for treatments at dialysis centers nearest to the residences of patients; and
- 11 (3) determine whether it is possible to improve coordination in the 12 scheduling of multiple dialysis patients living in close proximity to each other to allow 13 for a more efficient use of paratransit services.
- 14 (c) On or before December 15, 2013, the Department of Health and Mental 15 Hygiene shall report the findings of the study required under this section, and any 16 recommendations based on the study, to the Governor and, in accordance with § 17 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, 18 the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House 19 Health and Government Operations Committee.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
