A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **St. Mary's County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class 6 Pub–Brewery License**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Comptroller to issue a Class 6 pub–brewery
4 license to a holder of a certain alcoholic beverages license that is issued for use
5 on the premises of a restaurant located in St. Mary's County; and generally
6 relating to the issuance of a Class 6 pub–brewery license in St. Mary's County.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

20 2–207.

21 (a) A Class 6 pub–brewery license shall be issued:

22 (1) By the State Comptroller;

1 (2) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license
2 that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in the jurisdictions
3 permitted by this subsection;

4 (3) In the City of Annapolis; and

5 (4) Throughout the State, but not in the following subdivisions:

6 (i) Allegany County;

7 (ii) Caroline County;

8 (iii) Howard County; AND

9 (iv) [St. Mary's County; and

10 (v)] Somerset County.

11 (b) A holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license:

12 (1) May brew malt beverages at a single location for consumption on
13 the restaurant premises; and

14 (2) Is limited to the brewing of 2,000 barrels of malt beverage each
15 calendar year.

16 (c) The pub-brewery premises shall be located immediately adjacent to the
17 restaurant where the brewed beverage is to be sold to the public.

18 (d) The Class 6 pub-brewery license is void if:

19 (1) The restaurant ceases to be operated as a restaurant; or

20 (2) The holder's Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license is
21 revoked or transferred to a different location.

22 (e) If the holder's Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license is
23 suspended, the Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be suspended for the same period of
24 time.

25 (f) Except for a license transferred to a new location, a Class 6 pub-brewery
26 license may be transferred under § 10-503 of this article if an application for transfer
27 is filed with the local licensing board and simultaneously filed with the Office of the
28 Comptroller.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 July 1, 2013.
