## 2 St. Mary's County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class 6 Pub–Brewery License

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Comptroller to issue a Class 6 pub-brewery
  license to a holder of a certain alcoholic beverages license that is issued for use
  on the premises of a restaurant located in St. Mary's County; and generally
  relating to the issuance of a Class 6 pub-brewery license in St. Mary's County.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (a) A Class 6 pub–brewery license shall be issued:
- 22 (1) By the State Comptroller;
