16 17 18 19 20	(b) Except as provided in § 16–1002 of this title, a person who violates this section is guilty of <b>{</b> a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine of not more than \$2,500 <b>\$10,000</b> or imprisonment for not more than 5 years or both <b>{A FELONY</b> AND ON-CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$100,000 AND IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 5 YEARS.
