## Business Regulation - Cemeteries - Prohibited Acts and Penalties

3 FOR the purpose of altering a certain prohibition on establishing, operating, or 4 allowing a cemetery to be operated in violation of certain provisions of law 5 regarding the perpetual care of cemeteries; altering the penalties for violations 6 of certain provisions of law relating to perpetual care trusts, preneed trusts, and 7 the operation of a cemetery, crematory, or burial goods business; providing that 8 corporate officers who are responsible for a violation of certain provisions of law 9 relating to the perpetual care of cemeteries are guilty of a misdemeanor and are 10 subject to certain penalties; providing that a person who willfully 11 misappropriates or intentionally and fraudulently converts perpetual care trust 12 funds or preneed trust funds in excess of a certain amount is guilty of a felony and subject to a certain penalty; repealing certain obsolete language and 13 provisions of law relating to penalties for violations of certain provisions of law 14 15 regarding the perpetual care of cemeteries; and generally relating to cemeteries.
