1 AN ACT concerning

2 Potomac River Fisheries Commission – Inspection Tax and Penalty

- FOR the purpose of establishing a certain maximum oyster inspection tax that may be
 imposed by the Potomac River Fisheries Commission; requiring the Potomac
 River Fisheries Commission to use the proceeds of a certain oyster inspection
 tax for a certain purpose; increasing a certain maximum penalty for the
 violation of certain regulations; making this Act subject to a certain
 contingency; providing for the effective dates of this Act; and generally relating
 to the Potomac River Fisheries Commission.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

 Article III.
 Commission Powers and Duties
 Section 9. The commission may impose an inspection tax, in an amount as fixed from time to time by the commission, upon all oysters caught within the limits of the

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1 Potomac River, which inspection tax may not exceed [the higher severance tax per $\mathbf{2}$ bushel on oysters that is imposed by the Commonwealth of Virginia or the State of 3 Maryland in the waters of their respective jurisdictions] **\$2.00 PER BUSHEL**. The tax 4 shall be paid by the buyer at the place in Maryland or Virginia where the oysters are $\mathbf{5}$ unloaded from vessels and are to be shipped no further in bulk in vessel, to an agent of 6 the commission, or to such officer or employee of the Virginia Marine Resources 7Commission or of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, as may be 8 designated by the commission, and by him paid over to the commission. THE 9 COMMISSION SHALL USE THE PROCEEDS OF THE OYSTER INSPECTION TAX SOLELY FOR OYSTER REPLENISHMENT-RELATED PROGRAMS. 10

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 12 read as follows:

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Enforcement of Laws and Regulations: Penalties

17Section 2. The violation of any regulation of the commission shall be a misdemeanor. Unless a lesser punishment is provided by the commission, such 1819violation shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed [one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00)] 20**\$3,000** or confinement in a penal institution for not more than one (1) year, or both, in 21the discretion of the court, and any vessel, boat, or equipment used in the taking of 22finfish, crabs, oysters, clams, or other shellfish from the Potomac River in violation of 23any regulation of the commission or of applicable laws may be confiscated by the court, 24upon the abandonment thereof or the conviction of the owner or operator thereof.

25SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not take 26effect until a similar act is enacted by the Commonwealth of Virginia; that the 27Commonwealth of Virginia is requested to concur in this Act of the General Assembly of Maryland by the enactment of a similar act; that the Department of Legislative 2829Services shall notify the appropriate officials of the Commonwealth of Virginia of the 30 enactment of this Act; and that on the concurrence in this Act by the Commonwealth 31of Virginia, the Governor of the State of Maryland shall issue a proclamation declaring 32this Act valid and effective and shall forward a copy of the proclamation declaring this 33 Act valid and effective and shall forward a copy of the proclamation to the Executive 34Director of the Department of Legislative Services.

35 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 3 of 36 this Act, Section 1 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

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SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Sections 3 and
 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
