assist in the promotion of the success or defeat of a candidate ..."; i.e., to enhance the 1 2 electability of the person on whose behalf the campaign finance entity is established;

WHEREAS, State election law does not explicitly specify or limit the categories of expenditures that a campaign finance entity may make from a campaign account to "... promote or assist in the promotion of the success or defeat of a candidate ..."; and

WHEREAS, A letter of advice issued July 22, 2009, by the Attorney General of Maryland, Office of Counsel to the General Assembly, advises that campaign funds may not be used to fund a State legislator's travel, lodging, meals, and registration expenses at a legislative conference; and

11 WHEREAS, The purposes of many such meetings and conferences are to: (1) 12 educate participants about the legislative process; (2) inform participants regarding other states' legislative solutions to similar problems that may be impacting 13 14 Maryland; and (3) engage participants about issues and strategies to address matters 15 emanating from the federal government; now, therefore,

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 17

- 20 "Contribution" means the gift or transfer, or promise of gift or (0)(1) transfer, of money or other thing of value to a campaign finance entity to promote or 2122assist in the promotion of the success or defeat of a candidate, political party, or 23 question.
- 24"Contribution" includes proceeds from the sale of tickets to a 25 campaign fund-raising event.
- 26 "Expenditure" means a gift, transfer, disbursement, or promise of money 27 or a thing of value by or on behalf of a campaign finance entity to:
- 28 (1) promote or assist in the promotion of the success or defeat of a 29 candidate, political party, or question at an election; [or]
- 30 (2)pay for the publication expense of a legislative newsletter under 31 Title 13, Subtitle 4 of this article; OR
- 32 **(3)** PAY FOR TRAVEL, LODGING, MEALS, AND REGISTRATION 33 EXPENSES OF AN ELECTED OFFICIAL OR A CANDIDATE THAT ARE ASSOCIATED 34 WITH ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS OR CONFERENCES FOCUSED ON LEGISLATIVE
