2 Higher Education – Maryland First Scholarship – Creation and Funding

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland First Scholarship; establishing certain 3 eligibility requirements for the scholarship; requiring certain information to be 4 $\mathbf{5}$ provided in an application for the scholarship; authorizing the use of the 6 scholarship for certain educational expenses; authorizing the scholarship 7 awarded to be in an annual amount up to a certain percentage of certain tuition 8 and fees at certain institutions of higher education; requiring the scholarship 9 recipient to maintain a certain grade point average to be determined at a certain time; providing for the duration of the scholarship; requiring scholarship 10 applicants and recipients to file for certain federal and State financial aid by a 11 12certain date; establishing a certain fund; the Maryland First Scholarship Fund;
