A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education – Loan Assistance – Professional Counselors and Alcohol and Drug Counselors

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance of the $\mathbf{5}$ Maryland Higher Education Commission to assist in the repayment of certain 6 higher education loans owed by licensed clinical professional counselors or 7 licensed clinical alcohol and drug counselors under certain circumstances; requiring that funds for the Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Repayment 8 9 Program include certain money paid to the Program from certain fees collected by the State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists; requiring the 10 Comptroller to distribute a certain amount of the fees received from the State 11 12Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists to the Office of Student 13 Financial Assistance; and generally relating to the repayment of higher education loans owed by licensed clinical professional counselors and licensed 14clinical alcohol and drug counselors. 15
