1 AN ACT concerning

Video Lottery Operation Licensees – Information on Payouts

FOR the purpose of requiring that regulations adopted by the State Lottery and
Gaming Control Commission include provisions that require certain payouts to
be reported to the State Lottery and Gaming Control Agency in a report that
contains certain information; requiring that the State Lottery and Gaming
Control Agency forward the report to the Department of Human Resources
Child Support Enforcement Administration for certain purposes; and generally
relating to gaming payouts and the holding of a video lottery operation license.

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – State Government

4 9–1A–24.

5 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the Commission shall 6 ensure that a video lottery operation licensee complies with the requirements of this 7 section as a condition of holding the video lottery operation license.

8 (f) In order to protect the public interest, the regulations shall include 9 provisions that:

10 (1) limit the number and location of and maximum withdrawal 11 amounts from automated teller machines;

12 (2) prohibit authorized automated teller machines from accepting 13 electronic benefit cards, debit cards, or similar negotiable instruments issued by the 14 Department of Human Resources for the purpose of accessing temporary cash 15 assistance;

16 (3) require payouts above an amount adopted by the Commission to be17 made by check;

18 (4) REQUIRE ANY PAYOUT FOR WHICH A VIDEO LOTTERY 19 OPERATION LICENSEE IS REQUIRED TO FILE A FORM W-2G, OR A 20 SUBSTANTIALLY EQUIVALENT FORM, WITH THE UNITED STATES INTERNAL 21 REVENUE SERVICE ALSO BE REPORTED TO THE STATE LOTTERY AND GAMING 22 CONTROL AGENCY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (H) OF THIS SECTION, 23 INCLUDING THE NAME AND DATE OF BIRTH OF THE INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING THE 24 PAYOUT AND THE AMOUNT OF THE PAYOUT;

25 [(4)] (5) require conspicuous disclosures related to the payout of 26 video lottery terminals;

27 [(5)] (6) limit the dollar amount that video lottery terminals will 28 accept;

[(6)] (7) prohibit the use of specified negotiable instruments at video
 lottery facilities and the use of credit cards, debit cards, and similar devices in video
 lottery terminals;

32 [(7)] (8) provide consumers with a record of video lottery terminal 33 spending levels if marketing measures are utilized that track consumer spending at 34 video lottery facilities;

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1 [(8)] (9) prohibit consumers from cashing paychecks at video lottery 2 facilities; and

3 [(9)] (10) prohibit video lottery operation licensees from engaging in or 4 contracting with another to engage in predatory marketing practices.

 $\mathbf{5}$ ON RECEIPT OF THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (F)(4) **(H)** OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE LOTTERY AND GAMING CONTROL AGENCY SHALL 6 7PROMPTLY FORWARD A COPY OF THE REPORT TO THE CHILD SUPPORT 8 ENFORCEMENT **ADMINISTRATION OF** THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN 9 **RESOURCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENFORCING CHILD SUPPORT ORDERS** 10 ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE. 11

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2013.
