1 AN ACT concerning

Montgomery County - Board of Education Districts - Town of Kensington in One District

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MC 1–13

- FOR the purpose of altering the boundaries of certain board of education districts for
 the election of the members of the Montgomery County Board of Education;
 combining a certain split precinct for the Town of Kensington to place all of the
 residents of the precinct and of the Town of Kensington in one board of
 education district; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally
 relating to precincts and board of education districts for Montgomery County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

19 3–901.

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(a) (1) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

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2 (2) "Elected member" means 1 of the 7 elected and voting members of 3 the Montgomery County Board or a member appointed to fill a vacancy of 1 of these 7 4 members.

5 (3) "Board of Education District" means a geographic area of 6 Montgomery County in which an elected member of the Montgomery County Board of 7 Education must be a legal resident. The geographic area of each district is described in 8 subsection (f) of this section. Each district shall be substantially equal in population, 9 and the districts shall be reapportioned on the basis of each decennial census of the 10 United States.

- 11
 - (b) The Montgomery County Board consists of:

12 (1) 5 elected members, each of whom resides in a different board of 13 education district;

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- (2) 2 elected members who may reside anywhere in the county; and
- 15 (3) 1 student member.

16 (c) An elected member of the county board shall be a registered voter of 17 Montgomery County.

18 (d) Members of the Montgomery County Board shall be elected at the general
19 election every 2 years as required by subsection (f) of this section.

(e) (1) The student member shall be a bona fide resident of Montgomery
County and a regularly enrolled junior or senior year student from a Montgomery
County public high school.

(2) The nomination and election process shall be as agreed on by the
county board and the Montgomery County region of the Maryland Association of
Student Councils. This agreement shall include a process by which to replace one or
both of the final candidates if they are unable to proceed in the election. Any student
enrolled in a middle or high school in the Montgomery County public schools may:

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(i) Nominate a student member candidate;

(ii) Vote for delegates from the student's school, who in turn
vote in a nominating convention to reduce to 2 the number of candidates for student
board member if there are 3 or more candidates; and

32 (iii) Vote directly for 1 of the 2 remaining student board member33 candidates.

1 (3) The candidate receiving the second highest number of votes in the 2 direct election shall become the alternate student member. The alternate shall serve if 3 the student member is unable to complete his elected term.

4 (4) Except as provided in paragraphs (5), (6), and (7) of this 5 subsection, the student member has the same rights and privileges of an elected 6 member.

7 (5) Unless invited to attend by the affirmative vote of a majority of the 8 county board, the student member may not attend an executive session that relates to:

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(i) Hearings held under § 6–202(a) of this article; or

10 (ii) Collective bargaining.

11 (6) As provided in paragraph (7) of this subsection, the student 12 member shall vote on all matters except those relating to:

- 13 (i) $\S 6-202(a)$ of this article;
- 14 (ii) Collective bargaining;
- 15 (iii) Capital and operating budgets; and
- 16 (iv) School closings, reopenings, and boundaries.

17 (7) On a majority vote of the elected members, the board may 18 determine, on a case by case basis, whether a matter under consideration is covered by 19 the exclusionary provisions listed in paragraph (6) of this subsection.

(f) (1) Each elected member serves for a term of 4 years beginning on December 1 after the member's election and until a successor is elected and qualifies. The terms of elected members are staggered as required by the terms of the members serving on the county board as of July 1, 1978 so that 4 members are elected in gubernatorial election years and 3 members are elected in presidential election years.

(2) Elected members of the county board shall be elected by the voters of the entire county.

(3) (i) Of the 3 members elected in 1992 and every 4 years
thereafter, 1 shall reside in Board of Education District 2 and 1 shall reside in Board
of Education District 4. The third member may reside in any part of the county.

30 (ii) Of the 4 members elected in 1990 and every 4 years
31 thereafter, 1 shall reside in Board of Education District 1, 1 shall reside in Board of
32 Education District 3, and 1 shall reside in Board of Education District 5. The fourth
33 member may reside in any part of the county.

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1 (5) The remaining members of the county board shall select a qualified 2 individual to fill any vacancy on the elected board for the remainder of that term and 3 until a successor is elected and qualifies.

4 (6) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, an elected 5 county board member shall forfeit the office if the member fails to reside in the board 6 of education district from which the member was elected.

(ii) If the failure to continue to reside in the district is caused by
an alteration in the board of education district boundaries because of reapportionment,
the member may complete the term for which the member was elected.

10 (iii) In the event of a vacancy caused by a member who is 11 required to reside in a particular board of education district, the person appointed to 12 fill the vacancy shall reside in the same district at the time of appointment and while 13 filling out the unexpired term.

14 (g) (1) The Montgomery County Council may remove a member of the 15 county board for:

- 16 (i) Immorality;
- 17 (ii) Misconduct in office;
- 18 (iii) Incompetency; or
- 19 (iv) Willful neglect of duty.

20 (2) Before removing a member, the County Council shall provide the 21 member a copy of the charges against him and give him an opportunity within 10 days 22 to request a hearing.

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(3) If the member requests a hearing within the 10–day period:

(i) The County Council promptly shall hold a hearing, but a
hearing may not be set within 10 days after the County Council sends the member a
notice of the hearing; and

(ii) The member shall have an opportunity to be heard publiclybefore the County Council in the member's own defense, in person or by counsel.

(4) A member removed under this subsection has the right to a de
 novo review of the removal by the Circuit Court for Montgomery County.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2013 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation
 of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by

- 1 three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General
- 2 Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
