A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations Boards - Criminal History Records Checks - General Authority

4FOR the purpose of authorizing a health occupation board to adopt regulations $\mathbf{5}$ requiring applicants for an initial license or certificate to have a criminal 6 history records check in accordance with certain provisions of this Act; 7 authorizing a health occupation board to adopt regulations requiring certain 8 applicants for reinstatement of a lapsed license or certificate, removal from 9 inactive status, or renewal of a license or certificate to have a criminal history 10 records check in accordance with certain provisions of this Act; requiring an 11 applicant to submit certain fingerprints and fees to obtain a criminal history records check; providing that information obtained in a criminal history records 12check is confidential, may not be redisseminated, and may be used only for a 13 14certain purpose; authorizing certain individuals to contest certain information 15received from a criminal history records check; defining a certain term; and 16generally relating to general authority of health occupations boards to require criminal history records checks. 17

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²³ SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **1–220.**

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "CENTRAL REPOSITORY" MEANS THE CRIMINAL 3 JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT 4 OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.

5 (B) (1) EACH HEALTH OCCUPATION BOARD AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE A 6 LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE UNDER THIS ARTICLE MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS 7 THAT REQUIRE AN APPLICANT FOR AN INITIAL LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE TO 8 HAVE A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK IN ACCORDANCE WITH 9 SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION AS A CONDITION OF LICENSURE OR 10 CERTIFICATION.

11 (2) IF A HEALTH OCCUPATION BOARD ADOPTS REGULATIONS 12 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD MAY ADOPT 13 REGULATIONS TO REQUIRE AN APPLICANT FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING TO 14 HAVE A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK IN ACCORDANCE WITH 15 SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION:

16 (I) REINSTATEMENT OF A LAPSED LICENSE OR 17 CERTIFICATE;

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- (II) **REMOVAL FROM INACTIVE STATUS; OR**
- 19 (III) RENEWAL OF A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE.

20 (C) (1) AS PART OF AN APPLICATION TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY 21 FOR A STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, AN 22 APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY:

(I) TWO COMPLETE SETS OF LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS
TAKEN ON FORMS APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY
AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION;

26 (II) THE FEE AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10–221(B)(7) OF THE
27 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE FOR ACCESS TO STATE CRIMINAL HISTORY
28 RECORDS; AND

(III) THE PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL
BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION FOR A NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS
CHECK.

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1 (2) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10–201 THROUGH 10–228 OF THE 2 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL FORWARD 3 TO THE BOARD AND TO THE APPLICANT THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD 4 INFORMATION OF THE APPLICANT.

5 (3) IF AN APPLICANT HAS MADE TWO OR MORE UNSUCCESSFUL 6 ATTEMPTS AT SECURING LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS, THE BOARD MAY ACCEPT AN 7 ALTERNATE METHOD OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK AS PERMITTED 8 BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE 9 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.

10(4) INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY11UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE:

12(I)CONFIDENTIAL AND MAY NOT BE REDISSEMINATED;13AND

14(II)USED ONLY FOR THE LICENSING PURPOSE AUTHORIZED15BY THIS TITLE.

16 (5) THE SUBJECT OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK 17 UNDER THIS SECTION MAY CONTEST THE CONTENTS OF THE PRINTED 18 STATEMENT ISSUED BY THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AS PROVIDED IN § 10–223 19 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2013.
