## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Health Occupations - Massage Therapy - Authority to Practice

3 FOR the purpose of requiring an individual to be registered by the State Board of 4 Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners before the individual may 5 practice massage therapy in a certain setting; altering the number of hours and 6 content of certain education an applicant for a license to practice massage 7 therapy must complete to qualify for a license; repealing a certain provision of 8 law that prohibits an individual who is registered to practice non-therapeutic 9 massage from practicing in certain offices, hospitals, or facilities; altering certain definitions; repealing a certain definition; making conforming changes; 10 and generally relating to the practice of massage therapy in the State. 11

  - (b) If, after a hearing under § 3–315 of this title, the Board finds that there are grounds under subsection (a) of this section to suspend or revoke a license **OR REGISTRATION** to practice massage therapy [or registration to practice non–therapeutic massage], to reprimand a licensee or registration holder, or place a licensee or registration holder on probation, the Board may impose a penalty not exceeding \$5,000 in lieu of or in addition to suspending or revoking the licensee or registration, reprimanding the licensee or registration holder, or placing the licensee or registration holder on probation.
- 23 (c) (1) An individual whose license or registration has been suspended or revoked by the Board shall return the license or registration to the Board.
- 25 (2) If the suspended or revoked license or registration has been lost, 26 the individual shall file with the Board a verified statement to that effect.
- 27 (d) The Board shall file a notice for publication in the earliest publication of 28 the Maryland Register of each revocation or suspension of a license or registration 29 under this section within 24 hours of the revocation or suspension.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 3–5A–09 through 3–5A–16, respectively, of Article Health Occupations of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 3–5A–08 through 3–5A–15, respectively.
