#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Environment – Sewer Overflow or Treatment Plant Bypass – Electronic Notice

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of the Environment to publish all sewer  $\mathbf{5}$ overflow and treatment plant bypass reports on a single page on its Web site; 6 requiring the Department to develop and maintain a list containing the 7 electronic mail addresses of persons interested in receiving an electronic mail 8 notification of a sewer overflow or treatment plant bypass; requiring the 9 Department to include certain addresses on the list under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to remove certain addresses from the 10 list under certain circumstances; requiring the Department, on receipt of a 11 12telephone notification of a sewer overflow or treatment plant bypass, to notify 13 by electronic mail certain members of the General Assembly and certain other persons; and generally relating to electronic notice of sanitary sewer overflows 14and wastewater treatment plant bypasses. 15

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

25 (a) (1) The owner or operator of any sanitary sewer system, combined 26 sewer system, or wastewater treatment plant shall report to the Department any

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sewer overflow or treatment plant bypass that results in the direct or potential
 discharge of raw or diluted sewage into the surface waters or groundwaters of the
 State.

4 (2) The report shall be made by telephone as soon as practicable but 5 no later than 24 hours after the time that the operator or owner became aware of the 6 event.

7 (3) Within 5 calendar days after the telephone notification of the 8 event, the owner or operator shall provide the Department with a written report 9 regarding the incident that includes any information required by the Department.

10 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH ALL SEWER OVERFLOW 11 AND TREATMENT PLANT BYPASS REPORTS ON A SINGLE PAGE ON THE 12 DEPARTMENT'S WEB SITE.

(1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

14 (I) DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN A LIST CONTAINING THE
15 ELECTRONIC MAIL ADDRESSES OF PERSONS INTERESTED IN RECEIVING AN
16 ELECTRONIC MAIL NOTIFICATION OF A SEWER OVERFLOW OR TREATMENT
17 PLANT BYPASS;

(II) INCLUDE ON THE LIST DEVELOPED UNDER ITEM (I) OF
 THIS PARAGRAPH THE ELECTRONIC MAIL ADDRESS OF EACH PERSON THAT
 REQUESTS TO BE INCLUDED AND PROVIDES AN ADDRESS TO THE DEPARTMENT;
 AND

(III) REMOVE FROM THE LIST DEVELOPED UNDER ITEM (I)
 OF THIS PARAGRAPH THE ELECTRONIC MAIL ADDRESS OF ANY PERSON THAT
 REQUESTS TO BE REMOVED FROM THE LIST.

(2) ON RECEIPT OF A TELEPHONE NOTIFICATION OF A SEWER
OVERFLOW OR TREATMENT PLANT BYPASS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS
SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY BY ELECTRONIC MAIL:

28(I) EACH MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY29REPRESENTING THE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE OVERFLOW OR BYPASS OCCURRED30OR ANY OTHER DISTRICT WITHIN 1 MILE OF THE OVERFLOW OR BYPASS; AND

31(II)EACH PERSON INCLUDED ON THE LIST OF INTERESTED32PERSONS DEVELOPED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

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1 [(b)] (C) The Department, in cooperation with the Department of Health 2 and Mental Hygiene, the local health departments, and local environmental health 3 directors, shall develop procedures for requiring the owner or operator of any sanitary 4 sewer system, combined sewer system, or wastewater treatment plant to provide 5 public notification of a sewage overflow.

6 [(c)] (D) (1) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the 7 local health departments shall make all decisions and determinations as to public 8 health issues resulting from sewer overflows or treatment bypasses.

9 (2) The owner or operator of any sanitary sewer system, combined 10 sewer system, or wastewater treatment plant is not responsible for making public 11 health determinations regarding sewer overflow or treatment plant bypasses.

12 [(d)] (E) The Department shall adopt regulations to implement the 13 requirements of this section.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2013.
