## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Environment – Retail Service Stations – Setback Certification**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain retail service stations constructed after a certain 4 date to meet certain requirements; requiring a person constructing a certain  $\mathbf{5}$ retail service station on or after a certain date to apply to the Department of the 6 Environment for a setback certification; requiring the Department to issue a 7 setback certification if a certain retail service station meets certain 8 requirements; prohibiting a person from constructing a certain retail service 9 station on or after a certain date without a setback certification; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; stating the 10 findings of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the location of retail 11 12service stations.

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **10–504.** 

A RETAIL SERVICE STATION CONSTRUCTED AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2013, THAT IS PROJECTED TO SELL MORE THAN 3,600,000 GALLONS OF GASOLINE PER YEAR SHALL MEET THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER TITLE 6, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE.

- 9 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS THAT:

10 (1) RETAIL SERVICE STATIONS AND THE MOTOR VEHICLES USING 11 THEM RELEASE CHEMICALS, PARTICULATE MATTER, AND OTHER EMISSIONS, 12 INCLUDING BENZENE, 1,3–BUTADIENE, FORMALDEHYDE, ACETALDEHYDE, AND 13 PARTICULATE MATTER OF VARIOUS SIZES, THAT HAVE POTENTIALLY 14 HAZARDOUS, TOXIC, OR CARCINOGENIC EFFECTS ON HUMAN HEALTH AND THE 15 ENVIRONMENT;

16 (2) RESEARCH SHOWS THAT EXPOSURE TO PARTICULATE 17 MATTER INCREASES HEART AND LUNG DISEASE, ACUTE ASTHMA ATTACKS, AND 18 EARLY DEATH AND HAS A GREATER IMPACT ON CHILDREN, ELDERLY 19 INDIVIDUALS, AND INDIVIDUALS WITH EXISTING HEART OR LUNG DISEASE;

20 (3) THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY HAS 21 LOWERED THE ALLOWABLE LIMITS FOR PARTICULATE MATTER;

22 (4) PUBLIC HEALTH STUDIES SUGGEST THAT MOTOR VEHICLE 23 EMISSIONS HARM MENTAL HEALTH, INTELLIGENCE, AND EMOTIONAL 24 STABILITY;

25 (5) THE EFFECTS OF THESE EMISSIONS ARE DIRECTLY
26 PROPORTIONAL TO THE SIZE OF THE RETAIL SERVICE STATION AND THE RETAIL
27 SERVICE STATION'S PROXIMITY TO OTHER LAND USES;

(6) THE SIZE OF RETAIL SERVICE STATIONS HAS INCREASED
 DRAMATICALLY, WITH RETAIL SERVICE STATIONS SELLING APPROXIMATELY
 1,000,000 TO 2,000,000 GALLONS OF GASOLINE PER YEAR 15 YEARS AGO TO
 SELLING APPROXIMATELY 6,000,000 TO 19,000,000 GALLONS OF GASOLINE PER
 YEAR TODAY; AND

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1 (7) VARIOUS STUDIES RECOMMEND THAT LARGE RETAIL 2 SERVICE STATIONS BE SETBACK AT LEAST 300 FEET TO 1,000 FEET FROM AREAS 3 OF SENSITIVE USE.

5 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 6 INDICATED.

7 (B) "LARGE RETAIL SERVICE STATION" MEANS A RETAIL SERVICE 8 STATION THAT IS PROJECTED TO SELL MORE THAN 3,600,000 GALLONS OF 9 GASOLINE PER YEAR.

10 (C) "RETAIL SERVICE STATION" MEANS A RETAIL PLACE OF BUSINESS 11 AT WHICH MOTOR FUEL IS SOLD AND DELIVERED INTO THE FUEL SUPPLY TANKS 12 OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

13 **6–103.** 

14 (A) ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2013, A PERSON CONSTRUCTING A 15 LARGE RETAIL SERVICE STATION SHALL APPLY TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR A 16 SETBACK CERTIFICATION.

17 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A SETBACK CERTIFICATION IF THE 18 LARGE RETAIL SERVICE STATION WILL BE SETBACK AT LEAST 1,000 FEET, 19 BOUNDARY LINE TO BOUNDARY LINE, FROM:

- 20 (1) A HOSPITAL;
- 21 (2) A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY;
- 22 (3) A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL;
- 23 (4) A DAY CARE CENTER;
- **24 (5) A PLAYGROUND;**
- 25 (6) A PARK; OR

26 (7) AN OUTDOOR AREA THAT IS CATEGORIZED AS A CULTURAL, 27 ENTERTAINMENT, OR RECREATIONAL USE AREA.

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1 (C) A PERSON MAY NOT CONSTRUCT A LARGE RETAIL SERVICE STATION 2 ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2013, WITHOUT A SETBACK CERTIFICATION ISSUED 3 BY THE DEPARTMENT.

4 **6–104.** 

5 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 6 SUBTITLE.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect8 October 1, 2013.
