1 AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Equipment - Prohibition on Counterfeit Airbags and Substandard Airbags

4FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from making, distributing, or selling a $\mathbf{5}$ counterfeit airbag or a substandard airbag; prohibiting a person from installing 6 a counterfeit airbag or a substandard airbag in a motor vehicle; prohibiting a 7 person from selling or installing a device that causes the vehicle diagnostic 8 system to inaccurately indicate that the airbag is functional when a counterfeit 9 airbag or a substandard airbag is installed; prohibiting a person from 10 representing to another person that a counterfeit airbag or a substandard 11 airbag that is installed in a motor vehicle is not a counterfeit airbag or a 12substandard airbag; providing that if a person violates this Act and the violation contributes to the death or bodily injury of another, the person is 13 14guilty of a felony and subject to certain penalties; establishing certain penalties 15for violations of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to motor 16 vehicle equipment and counterfeit airbags and substandard airbags.

1 (4) REPRESENT TO ANOTHER PERSON THAT A COUNTERFEIT 2 AIRBAG OR A SUBSTANDARD AIRBAG THAT IS INSTALLED IN A MOTOR VEHICLE 3 IS NOT A COUNTERFEIT AIRBAG OR A SUBSTANDARD AIRBAG; OR

(5) ASSIST OR CAUSE A PERSON TO VIOLATE THIS SUBSECTION.

5 (C) IF A PERSON VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION AND THE 6 VIOLATION CONTRIBUTES TO THE BODILY INJURY OR DEATH OF ANOTHER, THE 7 PERSON IS GUILTY OF A FELONY AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO 8 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR 9 BOTH.

(z) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 21-1126 [or], §
21-1127, OR § 22-419(B) of this article is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction
is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.
