2 **Housing ~~Elderly~~ – Accessible Housing for Senior Homeowners Programs,**  
3 **Older Adults, and Individuals with Disabilities**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Accessible Homes for Senior Homeowners Grant  
5 Program; adding a certain grant program to the Maryland Housing  
6 Rehabilitation Program; adding a certain grant program to a certain list of  
7 special loan programs under the Maryland Housing Rehabilitation Program;  
8 authorizing the Department of Housing and Community Development to make  
9 certain grants to families of limited income under the Maryland Housing  
10 Rehabilitation Program under certain circumstances; providing an exception to  
11 the requirement that certain loans comply with certain conditions; authorizing  
12 the Department of Housing and Community Development to make grants ~~up to~~  
13 ~~a certain amount~~ to finance certain activities for certain elderly homeowners;  
14 authorizing the Department of Housing and Community Development to  
15 establish standards to determine eligibility for a certain grant program;

41 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 42 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3           (a)    In this section, “Fund” means the Special Loan Programs Fund.

4           (b)    There is a Special Loan Programs Fund.

5           (c)    As provided in the State budget and subject to subsection (d) of this  
6 section, the Department shall use the Fund to:

7                   (1)    operate, pay expenses of, and make loans under the Group Home  
8 Financing Program;

9                   (2)    operate, pay expenses of, and make grants and loans under the  
10 Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program and the Lead Hazard Reduction Loan  
11 Program;

12                   (3)    operate, pay expenses of, and make ~~GRANTS AND~~ loans AND  
13 GRANTS under the Maryland Housing Rehabilitation Program, including reserves for  
14 anticipated future losses directly related to the Maryland Housing Rehabilitation  
15 Program;

16                   (4)    make loans AND GRANTS under the Regular Rehabilitation  
17 Program; and

18                   (5)    make loans AND GRANTS under the special loan programs.

19           (d)    During the first 6 months of each fiscal year the Department shall  
20 reserve at least 25% of the appropriation for the Fund to make loans to rehabilitate  
21 buildings with four or fewer dwelling units.

22           (e)    (1)    The Department annually shall allocate money in the Fund to the  
23 Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program and the Lead Hazard Reduction Loan  
24 Program.

25                   (2)    If the number of eligible applications under the Lead Hazard  
26 Reduction Grant Program, or the Lead Hazard Reduction Loan Program is insufficient  
27 to commit all money allocated to that Program within 6 months after the allocation,  
28 the Department may reallocate the uncommitted money to other programs of the  
29 Fund.

30           (f)    The Fund shall be administered in accordance with this section.

31           (g)    (1)    The Fund consists of:

- 1 (i) money appropriated by the State for special loan programs,  
 2 including:
- 3 1. the Special Rehabilitation Program under § 4–906(b)  
 4 of this title;
- 5 2. the Regular Rehabilitation Program under § 4–906(b)  
 6 of this title;
- 7 3. the Group Home Financing Program under § 4–602 of  
 8 this title; [and]
- 9 4. the Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program under §  
 10 4–708 of this title and the Lead Hazard Reduction Loan Program under § 4–709 of this  
 11 title; AND

12 **5. THE ACCESSIBLE HOMES FOR SENIOR**  
 13 **HOMEOWNERS GRANT PROGRAM UNDER § 4–931 OF THIS TITLE;**

- 14 (ii) repayments of principal and payments of interest on loans  
 15 made under these programs;
- 16 (iii) repayments of grants from the Fund;
- 17 (iv) repayments of principal and payments of interest on loans  
 18 from the Fund;
- 19 (v) money transferred to the Fund in accordance with §§  
 20 4–502(e), 4–503(d), and 4–504(f) of this subtitle and §§ 3–203(i) and 6–310(g) of this  
 21 article; and
- 22 (vi) investment earnings of the Fund.

23 (2) The State, under § 4–501(c) of this subtitle, may appropriate to the  
 24 Fund money received as repayment of principal or payment of interest on a loan made  
 25 by the Maryland Housing Rehabilitation Program.

26 (h) Subject to § 7–209 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and  
 27 except as otherwise provided in the State budget, after the first 8 months of a fiscal  
 28 year, the Department may transfer unencumbered money in the Fund to any other  
 29 fund established under this title.

31 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

1           (d)   (1)   “Family of limited income” means a family or individual whose  
 2 income does not exceed the limits that the Secretary establishes under § 4–915 of this  
 3 subtitle.

4                   (2)   “Family of limited income” includes a trust described in 42 U.S.C. §  
 5 1396p(d)(4), or a trust established for the benefit of an individual with a disability by  
 6 an individual other than the beneficiary and that is funded with assets that were  
 7 never owned or controlled by the beneficiary, if:

8                           (i)   the income of the trust does not exceed the upper income

7 (a) (1) The Department may make Program loans for housing on terms  
8 that the Department considers necessary to make the housing affordable to families of  
9 limited income.

10 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY MAKE PROGRAM LOANS IN THE FORM  
11 OF A GRANT TO A FAMILY OF LIMITED INCOME IF:

12 (I) THE FAMILY OF LIMITED INCOME OWNS AND OCCUPIES  
13 THE DWELLING; AND

14 (II) THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THE FAMILY OF  
15 LIMITED INCOME CANNOT UNDERTAKE THE REHABILITATION PROJECT  
16 WITHOUT A GRANT.

17 [(2)] (3) The terms may include:

18 (i) deferred payment of principal and interest until the  
19 maturity date or the date of any sale or other transfer of the building or an interest in  
20 the building;

21 (ii) an interest rate as low as 0% or as high as is reasonable,  
22 given the incomes of the proposed occupants, if the interest rate does not violate any  
23 federal regulation governing the borrowing of money by the State;

24 (iii) increased interest rates or accelerated payments of principal  
25 and interest, if the borrower no longer qualifies for the Program loan; and

26 (iv) advance payments to a nonprofit sponsor for certain  
27 development costs, including architectural, engineering, and attorneys' fees.

29 (b) (1) Except as provided under paragraphs (2), (3), [and] (4), AND (5) of  
30 this subsection, a Program loan of more than \$5,000 shall be secured wholly or partly  
31 by a recorded mortgage or deed of trust on real property.

1           (2) A Program loan to a political subdivision may be secured by a  
2 recorded mortgage, deed of trust on real property, or other security device acceptable  
3 to the Department.

4           (3) A Program loan to a trust described in 42 U.S.C. § 1396p(d)(4) may  
5 be secured by a recorded mortgage, deed of trust on real property, or other security  
6 device acceptable to the Department.

7           (4) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a Program  
8 loan to a member of a cooperative housing corporation may be secured by a perfected  
9 security interest in the member's cooperative interest.

10           (ii) Before a Program loan is secured by a perfected security  
11 interest in the member's cooperative interest, the Department shall enter into an  
12 agreement with the cooperative housing corporation that establishes the rights and  
13 obligations of the Department and the cooperative housing corporation with respect to  
14 the secured cooperative interest.

15           **(5) A PROGRAM LOAN IN THE FORM OF A GRANT MAY BE**  
16 **UNSECURED OR SECURED BY A MORTGAGE, DEED OF TRUST, OR OTHER**  
17 **SECURITY DEVICE ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT.**

19 (a) The purpose of a rehabilitation project is:

20 (1) to bring a building to a decent, safe, and sanitary condition in  
21 accordance with applicable codes and standards, including those for construction,  
22 health, safety, fire, and occupancy;

23 (2) to maintain the building in that condition;

24 (3) to make the building more useful and attractive;

25 (4) to conform the building to the appropriate minimum livability  
26 code;

27 (5) to acquire a building containing more than four dwelling units for  
28 the purposes set forth in items (1) through (4) of this subsection;

29 (6) to provide, under applicable special loan programs:

30 (i) lead paint abatement;

31 (ii) indoor plumbing; or

1 (iii) shared, accessory, or sheltered housing;

2 (7) in the case of a loan **OR GRANT** to an elderly household or a  
3 disabled homeowner, to modify or improve a dwelling to make it more accessible or  
4 functional for the occupants, if the building is, or after improvements will be,  
5 structurally sound and free of health and safety hazards; or

6 (8) to provide, under applicable special loan pilot programs, radon  
7 abatement or asbestos abatement.

8 (b) (1) The applicable codes and standards under subsection (a)(1) of this  
9 section are:

10 (i) those in force in the political subdivision where the building  
11 is located; or

12 (ii) those that the Department sets by regulation for that  
13 political subdivision solely for purposes of this subtitle, if the political subdivision  
14 lacks codes and standards that the Secretary considers sufficient to promote the  
15 objectives of this subtitle.

16 (2) With the approval of the local enforcement authority, the Secretary  
17 may allow exceptions to a code or standard to preserve the historic or architectural  
18 value of a building undergoing rehabilitation under this subtitle.

12 EVIDENCE THAT THE APPLICANT CANNOT UNDERTAKE THE RENOVATION AND  
13 REPAIRS WITHOUT A GRANT.

14 (F) GRANTS UNDER THE GRANT PROGRAM MAY BE USED IN  
15 CONJUNCTION WITH OTHER:

16 (1) ACCESSIBLE HOUSING FOR SENIORS LOANS; AND

23 (2) how to listen to issues of concern and counsel homeowners who are  
24 older adults and individuals with disabilities on how to address issues of concern; and

25 (3) how to assist homeowners who are older adults and individuals  
26 with disabilities apply to specific housing, loan, or grant programs.

27 (c) The counseling provided by the Aging and Disability Resource Center  
28 Program on accessible housing programs and services shall be statewide, with  
29 particular attention given to communities with high concentrations of low-income  
30 elderly homeowners, including portions of:

31 (1) Anne Arundel County;
