21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
22	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

- 1 (a) Unless otherwise provided by law, a custodian shall deny inspection of a public record, as provided in this section.
- 3 (V) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A CUSTODIAN SHALL DENY INSPECTION OF ALL RECORDS OF A PERSON AUTHORIZED TO:
- 6 (I) SELL, PURCHASE, RENT, OR TRANSFER A REGULATED FIREARM UNDER TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE; OR
- 8 (II) CARRY, WEAR, OR TRANSPORT A HANDGUN UNDER 9 TITLE 5, SUBTITLE 3 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.
- 10 (2) A CUSTODIAN SHALL ALLOW INSPECTION OF FIREARM OR 11 HANDGUN RECORDS BY:
- 12 (I) THE INDIVIDUAL NAMED IN THE RECORD; OR
- 13 (II) THE ATTORNEY OF RECORD OF THE INDIVIDUAL NAMED 14 IN THE RECORD.
- 15 (3) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE
  16 CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE OR THE
  17 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES FROM
  18 ACCESSING FIREARM OR HANDGUN RECORDS IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THAT
  19 DEPARTMENT'S OFFICIAL DUTY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
