Nonpublic Schools Public and Nonpublic Schools – Epinephrine Availability and Use – Policy and Immunity

- FOR the purpose of authorizing nonpublic schools in the State to establish a policy to 4 5 authorize certain school personnel to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to 6 certain students under certain circumstances; requiring a certain policy certain 7 policies to include certain information; providing that a public school, certain nurses, and certain school personnel have certain immunity from civil liability 8 9 except in certain circumstances; providing that a nonpublic school and certain 10 school personnel have certain immunity from civil liability except in certain 11 circumstances; defining certain terms; and generally relating to an epinephrine availability and use policy in nonpublic schools of primary and secondary 12 13 education in the State.

5	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
6 7 8	(2) "Anaphylaxis" means a sudden, severe, and potentially life—threatening allergic reaction that occurs when an individual is exposed to an allergen.
9 10 11	(3) "Auto-injectable epinephrine" means a portable, disposable drug delivery device that contains a premeasured single dose of epinephrine that is used to treat anaphylaxis in an emergency situation.
12 13 14 15	(b) Each county board shall establish a policy for public schools within its jurisdiction to authorize the school nurse and other school personnel to administer auto-injectable epinephrine, if available, to a student who is determined to be or perceived to be in anaphylaxis, regardless of whether the student:
16 17	(1) Has been identified as having an anaphylactic allergy, as defined in § $7-426.1$ of this subtitle; or
18 19	(2) Has a prescription for epinephrine as prescribed by an authorized licensed health care practitioner under the Health Occupations Article.

- 9 (D) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, A PUBLIC
 10 SCHOOL, A SCHOOL NURSE, AND OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL WHO RESPOND IN
 11 GOOD FAITH TO THE ANAPHYLACTIC REACTION OF A CHILD IN ACCORDANCE

- 17 (2) The Department shall develop and disseminate a standard form to 18 report each incident requiring the use of auto-injectable epinephrine at a public 19 school.

- 23 (2) "ANAPHYLAXIS" MEANS A SUDDEN, SEVERE, AND 24 POTENTIALLY LIFE-THREATENING ALLERGIC REACTION THAT OCCURS WHEN 25 AN INDIVIDUAL IS EXPOSED TO AN ALLERGEN.
- 26 (3) "AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE" MEANS A PORTABLE, 27 DISPOSABLE DRUG DELIVERY DEVICE THAT CONTAINS A PREMEASURED SINGLE 28 DOSE OF EPINEPHRINE THAT IS USED TO TREAT ANAPHYLAXIS IN AN 29 EMERGENCY SITUATION.
- 30 (4) "SCHOOL PERSONNEL" MEANS INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE
 31 EMPLOYED BY A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, INCLUDING PART-TIME EMPLOYEES,
 32 TEACHERS AND SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL FOR AT
 33 LEAST 7 DAYS EACH SCHOOL YEAR, A SCHOOL NURSE, REGISTERED NURSE CASE
 34 MANAGER, DELEGATING NURSE, AND ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF.

 26 AND IMPLEMENT A METHOD FOR NOTIFYING THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF
 27 STUDENTS OF THE SCHOOL'S POLICY UNDER THIS SECTION AT THE BEGINNING
 28 OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR; AND
- 29 (5) (6) AN ONGOING PROCESS FOR OVERSIGHT AND
 30 MONITORING BY A LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER OF THE
 31 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF
 32 THIS SECTION.
- 33 (D) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, A
 34 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL WHO RESPOND IN GOOD FAITH

- 1 TO THE ANAPHYLACTIC REACTION OF A CHILD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS
- 2 SECTION ARE IMMUNE FROM CIVIL LIABILITY FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION IN THE
- 3 COURSE OF RESPONDING TO THE REACTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
