### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Police Training – Human Trafficking – Sensitivity and Awareness

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the Police Training Commission to require certain police training at certain intervals on the criminal laws related to human trafficking, including sensitivity and awareness training to recognize victims of human trafficking; and generally relating to police training related to human trafficking.

#### 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 3–207.

17 Subject to the authority of the Secretary, the Commission has the following 18 powers and duties:

19 (6) to require, for entrance-level police training and at least every 3 20 years for in-service level police training conducted by the State and each county and 21 municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study 22 include special training, attention to, and study of the application and enforcement of:

1 (i) the criminal laws concerning rape and sexual offenses, 2 including the sexual abuse and exploitation of children and related evidentiary 3 procedures;
