## 2 Hospitals – Notice to Patients – Outpatient Status and Billing Implications

FOR the purpose of requiring a hospital, under certain circumstances, to provide
certain notice to a patient of the patient's outpatient status and the billing
implications of the outpatient status; requiring the Department of Health and
Mental Hygiene, in consultation with certain hospitals, to adopt by regulation
standard language for standardized elements to be included in a certain written
notice; and generally relating to notices provided by hospitals to patients.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **19–349.1**.

18 (A) A HOSPITAL SHALL PROVIDE ORAL AND WRITTEN NOTICE TO A 19 PATIENT OF THE PATIENT'S OUTPATIENT STATUS AND THE BILLING 20 IMPLICATIONS OF THE OUTPATIENT STATUS IF:

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

Underlining indicates amendments to bill.

Strike out indicates matter stricken from the bill by amendment or deleted from the law by amendment.



1 (1) THE PATIENT RECEIVES ON-SITE SERVICES FROM THE 2 HOSPITAL FOR MORE THAN <del>18</del> <u>23</u> CONSECUTIVE HOURS;

3 (2) THE ON-SITE SERVICES RECEIVED BY THE PATIENT INCLUDE
4 A HOSPITAL BED AND MEALS THAT HAVE BEEN PROVIDED IN AN AREA OF THE
5 HOSPITAL OTHER THAN THE EMERGENCY ROOM; AND

6 (3) THE PATIENT IS CLASSIFIED AS AN OUTPATIENT AT THE 7 HOSPITAL FOR OBSERVATION RATHER THAN AN ADMITTED INPATIENT.

8 (B) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH HOSPITALS IN THE 9 <u>STATE</u>, SHALL ADOPT BY REGULATION <del>STANDARD LANGUAGE FOR</del> 10 <u>STANDARDIZED ELEMENTS TO BE INCLUDED IN</u> THE WRITTEN NOTICE 11 REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect13 October 1, 2013.
