CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Commission on Special Education Access and Equity

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Special Education Access and 3 4 Equity; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; $\mathbf{5}$ prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, 6 but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 Commission to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; 8 requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations to the 9 Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 10 Commission on Special Education Access and Equity. 11

rights under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (ii) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; access to and participation in Individualized Education Plan (iii) Program mediation and appeals; and (iv) access to and participation in free and reduced price meals; effects of workload, caseload, and paperwork requirements related (3)to the special education process on the ability of educators to provide a free and appropriate public education as guaranteed under federal law, and potential methods for mitigating these factors; concerns about equity between the parties in special education due (4)process hearings, and potential methods for improving the process, including the viability of establishing a system of voluntary binding arbitration in these cases as an alternative method of resolving disputes; and; the State and local costs of all proposals considered or (5)recommended by the Commission: and (5) (6) any other issues related to access and equity in the provision of special education services under federal and State law identified by the Commission. On or before December 15, 2013 June 30, 2014, the Commission shall (g) report its findings and recommendations on these issues relating to access and equity in the provision of special education services under federal and State law to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Ways and Means Committee.

24SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the 2526end of $\frac{May 31}{2}$ June 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General 27Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
