A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Street Lighting - Purchase of Equipment by Local Government and Tariffs

FOR the purpose of requiring a local government to pay a certain electric company the 3 fair market value of certain street lighting equipment as determined by an 4 5 agreement between the local government and the electric company or as 6 determined in a condemnation proceeding under certain circumstances; 7 authorizing a local government to include all street lighting equipment that the 8 local government seeks to acquire in its jurisdiction that is owned by one 9 electric company in a single petition of condemnation under certain circumstances; requiring a jury in a certain condemnation proceeding to 10 consider certain factors in determining fair market value of street lighting 11 12 equipment under certain circumstances; requiring the Public Service Commission to require each electric company to develop one or more tariffs for 13 certain street lighting; requiring certain tariffs to include certain unbundled 14 services; authorizing certain unbundled services to be performed at the request 15 16 of a certain local government; requiring that a certain tariff include only electric 17 distribution and certain pole attachment fees; providing that the Commission 18 does not have jurisdiction over the operation and maintenance of certain street 19 lighting equipment under certain circumstances; making a certain clarifying 20 change; and generally relating to the acquisition of street lighting equipment by 21 a local government from an electric company and tariffs for street lighting.

3 4	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
5	Article 24 – Political Subdivisions – Miscellaneous Provisions

7 8	(a) In this section, "electric company" has the meaning stated in § 1–101 of the Public Utilities Article.
9 10 11 12	(b) On written request by a local government, an electric company shall sell to the local government [some or all of] the electric company's existing street lighting equipment [that is located] AT SOME OR ALL LOCATIONS within the local jurisdiction.
13 14 15 16 17	(c) (1) If the local government purchases street lighting equipment from an electric company, the local government shall pay to the electric company the fair market value of the street lighting equipment AS DETERMINED BY AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND THE ELECTRIC COMPANY OR AS DETERMINED IN A CONDEMNATION PROCEEDING.
18 19 20 21	(2) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY INCLUDE IN A SINGLE PETITION FOR CONDEMNATION ALL STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT THAT THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SEEKS TO ACQUIRE WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION THAT IS OWNED BY ONE ELECTRIC COMPANY.
22 23 24	(3) IN A CONDEMNATION PROCEEDING BROUGHT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION, THE JURY DETERMINING FAIR MARKET VALUE SHALL CONSIDER:
25 26	(I) THE AGE, CONDITION, TYPE, AND OPERABILITY OF THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT;
27 28 29	(II) ANY PAST PAYMENT OR CONTRIBUTION BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO THE ELECTRIC COMPANY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT;
30 31	(III) COMPARABLE SALES OR OTHER APPROPRIATE INDICATION OF THE VALUE OF THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT; AND

32 (IV) ANY OBLIGATION BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO PAY 33 FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT IF THE

OBLIGATION TO PAY FOR THE MAINTENANCE MAY NOT BE TERMINATED WITHOUT GIVING AT LEAST **60** DAYS NOTICE.

- (d) A local government that purchases the street lighting equipment in accordance with subsection (b) of this section shall be responsible for the maintenance of the street lighting equipment and may contract with an outside entity for the maintenance of the street lighting equipment.
- (e) (1) Any person who controls the right to use space on any pole, lamppost, or other mounting surface previously used in the local jurisdiction by the electric company for street lighting equipment shall allow a local government that has purchased the street lighting equipment to assume the rights and obligations of the electric company with respect to the space for the unexpired term of any lease or other agreement under which the electric company used the space.
- (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) of this subsection, the local government may not restrict or prohibit universal access for electricity or any other service by assuming the rights and obligations of an electric company as to space on any pole, lampost, or other mounting surface used for street lighting equipment.
- 17 (3) Any dispute between an electric company and a local government 18 arising under this subsection shall be submitted to the Public Service Commission for 19 resolution.

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- 22 (A) (1) FOR UNDERGROUND-FED STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT
 23 OWNED BY A LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND MOUNTED TO POLES ALSO OWNED BY
 24 THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT, THE COMMISSION SHALL REQUIRE EACH ELECTRIC
 25 COMPANY TO DEVELOP ONE OR MORE TARIFFS.
- 26 (2) (I) A TARIFF ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) SHALL 27 INCLUDE UNBUNDLED REACTIVE AND PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES.
- 28 (II) THE UNBUNDLED SERVICES MAY BE PERFORMED AT 29 THE REQUEST OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT.
- 30 (B) **(1)** FOR OVERHEAD-FED STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT OWNED 31 BY A LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND MOUNTED TO POLES OWNED BY A PUBLIC 32 SERVICE COMPANY, THE COMMISSION SHALL REQUIRE EACH ELECTRIC 33 **COMPANY** TO **DEVELOP** \mathbf{A} **TARIFF** THAT **INCLUDES** ONLY **ELECTRIC** 34 DISTRIBUTION FEES AND POLE ATTACHMENT FEES, IF ANY.

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- 1 (2) THE COMMISSION DOES NOT HAVE JURISDICTION OVER THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF STREET LIGHTING EQUIPMENT DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2013.
