A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Education - Maryland Charter School Advisory Council - Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Charter School Advisory Council within 4 the State Department of Education; requiring the Department to provide staff 5 for the Council; establishing the mission of the Council; establishing the 6 membership of the Council; establishing the membership term; specifying the 7 terms of the initial members of the Council; requiring the Governor or the 8 Department to appoint a member in the event of a vacancy; requiring the 9 Council members to elect the Council chair; prohibiting a member from receiving compensation except under certain circumstances; establishing a 10 quorum of the Council; requiring the Council to meet for a certain number of 11 12 times; establishing the responsibilities of the Council; requiring the Council to 13 submit a certain report by a certain time; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Maryland Charter School Advisory Council. 14

3	(B) IN MAKING THE APPOINTMENTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION.
4	THE GOVERNOR AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE:
5	(1) THAT THE COUNCIL IS REPRESENTATIVE OF ALL
6	GEOGRAPHIC AREAS OF THE STATE; AND
7	(2) THAT THE INDIVIDUALS SELECTED HAVE DEMONSTRATED AN
8	UNDERSTANDING OF AND COMMITMENT TO CHARTER SCHOOLING AS A
9	STRATEGY FOR STRENGTHENING PUBLIC EDUCATION.
10	(C) OVERALL, MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL POSSESS A HIGH
11 12	LEVEL OF KNOWLEDGE, EXPERIENCE, AND EXPERTISE IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

22	(3) At the end of a term, a member shall continue to
23	SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
24	(4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN
25	SHALL SERVE FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE TERM OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
26	APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

16 17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial members of the Maryland Charter School Advisory Council shall expire as follows:

20	(3) five members in 2016.
21 22	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
