- FOR the purpose of requiring a local board of elections to conduct a random drawing of
 the names of the candidates for election for circuit court judge to determine the
 order of the names on the ballot; requiring the drawing to be conducted in the
 manner required by the State Board of Elections; and generally relating to the
 placement of names on the ballot of candidates for election as judge of the
 circuit court.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

 (j) (1) In a primary election:
 (i) on a voting machine ballot, the names of the candidates for party nomination shall be grouped together by party; and
 (ii) on a document ballot, the ballot shall include only the names

1 (i) on a voting machine ballot, the names of the candidates of a 2 political party shall be grouped together in adjacent rows or columns, and the majority 3 party candidates shall be placed in the first row or column, followed by the candidates 4 of the principal minority party, followed by other political parties in descending order 5 based on the number of voters registered with the party, and finally by candidates not 6 nominees of a political party; and

7 (ii) on a document ballot, for each office the names of candidates 8 shall be grouped together by party, with the majority party candidate or candidates 9 listed first, followed by the candidate or candidates of the principal minority party, 10 followed by the candidate or candidates of other political parties in descending order 11 based on the statewide registration of the party, and finally by candidates who are not 12 nominees of a political party.

13 (3) (I) [In] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF 14 THIS PARAGRAPH, IN both primary elections and general elections, when there is 15 more than one candidate of the same political party for nomination or election to an 16 office, the names of the candidates in the group shall be listed in alphabetical order by 17 surname. In the primary election, candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor 18 shall be arranged in the order of surnames of the gubernatorial candidates.

19 (II) 1. IN BOTH PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS, IN 20 AN ELECTION FOR A JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT, WHEN THERE IS MORE 21 THAN ONE CANDIDATE OF THE SAME POLITICAL PARTY FOR NOMINATION OR 22 ELECTION, A LOCAL BOARD SHALL CONDUCT A RANDOM DRAWING TO 23 DETERMINE THE ORDER OF THE NAMES OF THE CANDIDATES ON THE BALLOT.

24 **2. THE DRAWING SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN A** 25 **MANNER REQUIRED BY THE STATE BOARD.**
