10 11 12 13	1. IS COMPOSED OF RESIDENTS OF A CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY THAT HAS OBTAINED A CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION FROM THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGING UNDER TITLE 10 SUBTITLE 4 OF THE HUMAN SERVICES ARTICLE;
14 15	2. OPERATES SOLELY FOR THE USE OF ITS RESIDENTS AND GUESTS OF THE COMMUNITY; AND
16 17	3. IS NOT DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY OWNED OF OPERATED AS A PUBLIC BUSINESS.
18 19 20	(III) A LICENSEE MAY KEEP FOR SALE AND SELL AT RETAIL TO A RESIDENT OR A GUEST OF THE COMMUNITY BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE LICENSED PREMISES.
21	(IV) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$250.
