## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## State Government - Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues - Placement and Commission

FOR the purpose of requiring that a Frederick Douglass Memorial Statue and a Harriet Tubman Memorial Statue be placed on the grounds of the State House in a certain location; requiring the Commission on Artistic Property to oversee the care and maintenance of the statues; establishing the Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues; prohibiting a member of the Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues to develop and implement a process to create certain memorial statues and take other certain action relating to the creation of the memorial statues; requiring the Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues to submit a certain interim report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of a certain provision of this Act; and generally relating to the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman Memorial Statues.

6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
8	Article - State Government
9	9–1016.
10 11	In this Part II of this subtitle, "Commission" means the Commission on Artistic Property.
12	9–1021.
13 14 15 16	(a) (1) The Commission is the official custodian of all valuable paintings and other objects of decorative art owned by or loaned to the State, except those located in a State room of the Government House. With respect to the objects subject to its official custody, the Commission shall:
17	(i) keep a continuing inventory of the objects; and
18 19	(ii) be responsible for and supervise the acquisition, custody, display, location, preservation, proper care, security, and restoration of the objects.
20	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
21 22 23	(a) A Frederick Douglass Memorial Statue and a Harriet Tubman Memorial Statue shall be placed on the grounds of the State House, one on each side of the Roger Brooke Taney Statue.
24 25 26	(b) The Commission on Artistic Property shall oversee the care and maintenance of the Frederick Douglass Memorial Statue and the Harriet Tubman Memorial Statue after the statues are placed on the grounds of the State House.
27	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
28 29	(a) There is a Commission on the Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubmar Memorial Statues.
30	(b) (1) The Commission consists of the following members:

two members appointed by the President of the Senate;

$\frac{1}{2}$	(ii) two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and
3	(iii) three members appointed by the Governor.
4 5 6	(2) Individuals appointed to the Commission under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall have training, expertise, or special interests that will benefit the purposes of the Commission.
7	(c) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Commission.
8 9 10 11 12	(d) The Division of Historical and Cultural Programs in the Department of Planning shall provide staff for the Commission, in consultation with other appropriate agencies, including the State House Trust, the Maryland State Arts Council, the Commission on African American History and Culture, and the Department of General Services.
13	(e) A member of the Commission:
14	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but
15 16	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
17	(f) The Commission shall:
18 19 20	(1) develop and implement a process to create memorial statues of Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman, including determining the feasibility of the project, site planning, design competition, execution, and installation;
21 22	(2) advise the Governor, the General Assembly, and State agencies on matters relating to the memorial statues;
23 24 25 26	(3) as soon as practicable, but no later than December 31, 2013, develop a plan and capital program sufficient to support a capital budget appropriation for construction and installation of the memorial statues and any associated improvements;
27	(4) perform other duties necessary to create the memorial statues; and
28	(5) complete all of its duties by June 30, 2015.
29 30 31	(g) On or before June 30, 2014, the Commission shall submit an interim report on the progress of the Commission in completing its duties to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2013. Section 3 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Section 3 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
