$\mathbf{2}$ State Board of Physicians - Quasi-Judicial Powers - Revision

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Physicians to issue a cease and 4 desist order or obtain injunctive relief for taking any action that may be $\mathbf{5}$ grounds for discipline under a certain provision of law and that poses a certain 6 risk to a patient; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations to carry out a 7 certain provision of law; and generally relating to the quasi-judicial powers of 8 the State Board of Physicians.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 1415MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Health Occupations

17 14 - 206.

18 Over the signature of an officer, the executive director, or the deputy (a) 19director of the Board, the Board may issue subpoenas and administer oaths in 20connection with any investigation under this title and any hearings or proceedings before it. 21

22(b)If, without lawful excuse, a person disobeys a subpoena from the Board or 23an order by the Board to take an oath or to testify or answer a question, then, on 24petition of the Board, a court of competent jurisdiction may punish the person as for 25contempt of court.

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1 (c) If after due notice the individual against whom the action is 2 contemplated fails or refuses to appear, nevertheless the Board may hear and 3 determine the matter.

4 (d) (1) If the entry is necessary to carry out a duty under this title, the 5 Board's executive director or other duly authorized agent or investigator of the Board 6 may enter at any reasonable hour:

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(i) A place of business of a licensed physician;

8 (ii) Private premises where the Board suspects that a person 9 who is not licensed by the Board is practicing, attempting to practice, or offering to 10 practice medicine, based on a formal complaint; or

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(iii) Public premises.

12 (2) A person may not deny or interfere with an entry under this 13 subsection.

14 (3) A person who violates any provision of this subsection is guilty of a 15 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100.

16 (e) The Board may issue a cease and desist order or obtain injunctive relief 17 for [practicing]:

18 (1) **PRACTICING** medicine without a license; **OR**

19 (2) TAKING ANY ACTION THAT:

20(I)MAY BE GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE UNDER § 14-404 OF21THIS TITLE; AND

22 (II) POSES A SERIOUS RISK TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND 23 WELFARE OF A PATIENT.

24 (F) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE 25 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING HEARING PROCEDURES AND 26 SANCTIONS FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
October 1, 2013.

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
