# State Board of Physicians – Consultation, Qualification for Licensure, License Renewal, and Representation to the Public

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain physicians engaged in certain consultations to  $\mathbf{5}$ practice medicine without a license from the State Board of Physicians under 6 certain circumstances; authorizing certain applicants to qualify for licensure 7 under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to send certain notices and 8 certain data sheets to certain licensees by certain means; making certain 9 stylistic changes; prohibiting certain physicians from making certain representations unless the physician is board certified; defining certain terms; 10 11 making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the licensure 12of physicians in the State.
