## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Family Investment Program – Family Literacy Pilot Program

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Human Resources to establish the 4 Family Literacy Pilot Program in the Department of Human Resources; limiting  $\mathbf{5}$ the Program to a certain number of recipients; requiring the Secretary to 6 cooperate with local directors of social services and to consult with the 7 Maryland State Department of Education and certain adult literacy providers 8 regarding the establishment of the Program; establishing the purpose of the 9 Program; providing for the components of the Program, including the implementation of certain policies and procedures in certain local departments 10 that increase adult and family participation in certain programs; requiring the 11 12Program to target certain parents or caregivers in certain schools; providing a 13 certain bonus to certain FIP recipients who complete certain programs; requiring the Secretary to submit a certain annual report to the Senate Finance 14Committee and the House Appropriations Committee; providing for the contents 1516 of the annual report; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of 17this Act; and generally relating to the Family Literacy Pilot Program and the 18 Family Investment Program.

<sup>24</sup> SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **5–318.1.** 

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE FAMILY LITERACY 3 PILOT PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.

4 (B) (1) IN COOPERATION WITH THE LOCAL DIRECTORS, AND IN 5 CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION 6 AND COMMUNITY-BASED ADULT LITERACY PROVIDERS, THE SECRETARY SHALL 7 ESTABLISH A FAMILY LITERACY PILOT PROGRAM.

8 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO EQUIP FIP ELIGIBLE 9 PARENTS RECEIVING TEMPORARY CASH ASSISTANCE WITH THE SKILLS AND 10 TOOLS TO ENGAGE THEIR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN LITERACY–BASED 11 ACTIVITIES, WITH THE GOAL OF ULTIMATELY IMPROVING PARENTS' ECONOMIC 12 CIRCUMSTANCES AND CHILDREN'S ACADEMIC SUCCESS.

13 (3) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE LIMITED TO 500 FIP RECIPIENTS IN
14 BALTIMORE CITY AND ONE OTHER COUNTY.

15 (C) IN ADDITION TO THE FIP REQUIREMENTS FOR RECIPIENTS UNDER 16 § 5–309(B) OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE PROGRAM SHALL:

17 (1) IMPLEMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES IN LOCAL 18 DEPARTMENTS TO ENCOURAGE INCREASED ADULT AND FAMILY PARTICIPATION 19 IN PROGRAMS, INCLUDING, OR SIMILAR TO, INCENTIVE-BASED ADULT 20 LITERACY PROGRAMS AND THE MARYLAND STATE DEPARTMENT OF 21 EDUCATION'S EVEN START FAMILY LITERACY PROGRAM; AND

22(2)TARGET PARENTS OR CAREGIVERS OF STUDENTS IN SCHOOLS23WITH DOCUMENTED LOW PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT AND HIGH TRUANCY.

24 (D) A FIP RECIPIENT WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES A FAMILY 25 LITERACY PROGRAM UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE 26 PROVIDED WITH A \$500 BONUS.

27 (E) THE SECRETARY SHALL REPORT ANNUALLY TO THE SENATE 28 FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, IN 29 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE 30 EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

31 (1) THE NUMBER OF FAMILY LITERACY PROGRAMS AVAILABLE 32 FOR FIP RECIPIENTS;

1 (2) THE NUMBER OF FIP RECIPIENTS PARTICIPATING IN THE 2 PROGRAM;

## 3 (3) THE NUMBER OF FIP RECIPIENTS SUCCESSFULLY 4 COMPLETING THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING THE NUMBER OF BONUSES PAID; AND

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### (4) FACTORS THAT AFFECT PROGRAM PARTICIPATION.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 8 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 9 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
