4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Prince George's County Juvenile Court and $\mathbf{5}$ School Safety Workgroup; providing for the composition, chair co-chairs, and 6 staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from 7receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 8 expenses; requiring the Workgroup to develop certain policies and protocols, 9 create a certain process, develop criteria for certain programs, and hold certain 10 meetings, and convene certain groups annually; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the Prince George's County 11 Delegation on or before a certain date; requiring the Workgroup to report 12annually under certain circumstances; providing for the termination of this Act; 13 and generally relating to the Prince George's County Juvenile Court and School 14 Safety Workgroup. 15

- 18 **(4)** DEVELOP CRITERIA FOR DIVERSION PROGRAMS, INCLUDING 19 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS DEVELOPED FOR JUVENILES WHO HAVE BEEN 20 CHARGED WITH LESS SERIOUS DELINQUENT ACTS AND WHO THE JUVENILE 21 COURT BELIEVES ARE NOT DELINQUENT JUVENILES AND LIKELY DO NOT 22 REQUIRE PROBATION OR COMMITMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE 23 SERVICES;
- 24(5)Hold at least three public meetings before October251, 2013, DURING WHICH THE WORKGROUP ACCEPTS PUBLIC TESTIMONY; AND

26(6)CONVENE STAKEHOLDERS ANNUALLY TO ASSESS AND REVISE,27IF NECESSARY, THE DECISION MAKING PROCESS AND PROCEDURES.

- 28 (G) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2013, THE WORKGROUP SHALL 29 REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE PRINCE GEORGE'S 30 COUNTY DELEGATION.
- 31 (2) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE WORKGROUP
 32 SHALL REPORT TO THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY DELEGATION ANY
 33 REVISIONS TO THE WORKGROUP'S RECOMMENDATIONS MADE AFTER ITS
 34 ANNUAL STAKEHOLDER MEETING.
- 35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 June 1, 2013. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months and, at the</u>

- 1 end of December 31, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
- 2 <u>this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.</u>
