3 FOR the purpose of altering the date by which the Department of Legislative Services 4 must conduct a preliminary evaluation of certain governmental activities or $\mathbf{5}$ units and prepare certain reports; specifying the entities subject to a 6 preliminary evaluation; specifying the year in which a preliminary evaluation 7 must be conducted; altering certain elements required in a report on a preliminary 8 evaluation: requiring the Department \mathbf{to} consider making а certain 9 recommendation if certain problems are identified; requiring the Department to 10 submit certain reports to the Legislative Policy Committee; altering the date by 11 which the Legislative Policy Committee must make a certain determination; 12requiring the Department to conduct a full evaluation of a governmental activity or 13 unit under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to prepare a certain 14report on each full evaluation conducted; specifying the entities subject to a full 15evaluation without the need for a preliminary evaluation; specifying the year in 16 which a full evaluation must be conducted; altering the date by which the 17Department must complete certain full evaluation reports; specifying the focus of a full evaluation report; requiring the Department to submit certain reports to 18 19certain committees of the General Assembly; altering the date by which certain 20committees of the General Assembly must hold certain public hearings; requiring 21certain committees of the General Assembly rather than certain evaluation 22committees to submit a certain report to the General Assembly; altering the 23recommendations that must be included in certain reports; repealing the 24requirement that an evaluation be completed by an evaluation committee; 25repealing the requirement that an evaluation plan be completed; requiring certain 26entities to provide certain information and cooperate with the Department to carry 27out certain requirements; authorizing certain information to be provided to the 28Department in a certain format; requiring the Department to follow certain 29confidentiality procedures; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the 30 Maryland Program Evaluation Act.
