FOR the purpose of altering the Banquet Facility license in Frederick County by 3 4 specifying that the license entitles the holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor; 5 specifying that a certain requirement concerning minimum serving capacity 6 may be met by persons who are inside the facility or outside on the premises; 7 repealing the requirement that a facility be eligible for inclusion in a certain 8 national register; altering a certain minimum capital investment requirement 9 for licensees; authorizing a licensee to sell beer, wine, or liquor for off-premises consumption in collectible bottles under certain circumstances; and generally 10 relating to banquet facility licenses in Frederick County. 11

- 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

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1 This subsection applies only in Frederick County. (1) (1) 2 The Board of License Commissioners may issue a Class (4) 3 B-B.F. (Banquet Facility) beer, [light] wine and liquor on-sale license for a banquet facility that: 4 5 1. Accommodates the public for banquets, parties, 6 meetings, and similar functions; 7 2. Contains a dining room with adequate facilities for preparing and serving full-course meals for at least 100 persons WHO ARE INSIDE 8 THE FACILITY OR OUTSIDE ON THE PREMISES at one seating; AND 9 10 3. Is eligible for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places; and 11 12 4. Has a capital investment of not less than [\$500,000] 13 \$250,000, excluding the cost of the land, buildings, and leases. The Class B-B.F. beer, [light] wine and liquor license 14 (ii) authorizes the holder to keep for sale, and sell at retail, beer, [light] wine, and liquor 15 by the drink or by the bottle for on-premises consumption only; provided that: 16 17 The beer, [light] wine, and liquor are only sold during 1. 18 the function; 19 2. [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH 20 (III) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE licensee may not sell alcoholic beverages for 21off-premises consumption; 22 The licensee may not permit alcoholic beverages to be 23carried off the premises; and 244. Food is furnished at the function where the alcoholic 25beverages are provided. 26 (III) A LICENSEE MAY SELL BEER, WINE, OR LIQUOR FOR 27 OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION IF THE BEER, WINE, OR LIQUOR IS: 28 1. IN A COLLECTIBLE BOTTLE COMMEMORATING A 29 SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY OR EVENT; AND 30 2.

BEFORE THE SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY OR EVENT.

- 1 [(iii)] (IV) The days and hours of sale under this license are as 2 provided in § 11–511 of this article.
- 3 [(iv)] (V) The annual license fee for a Class B–B.F. license is 4 + 1,500.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2013.
