3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Veterans Trust as a corporate entity; 4 providing for the membership, terms, staffing, and reimbursement of certain $\mathbf{5}$ expenses of the Board of Trustees of the Trust; establishing the Maryland 6 Veterans Trust Fund and authorizing the Trust to maintain the Fund and 7 expend money from the Fund to provide grants and loans to veterans and their 8 families and to programs that support veterans and their families; repealing 9 requirements for the State Treasurer to invest the money in the Fund and for 10 any investment earnings of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; granting 11 certain powers and duties to the Board of Trustees and the Trust, including
