1 (3) Each judge shall also receive an expense allowance, in addition, up 2 to \$50 per month, for personal expenses incidental to the judge's duties, to be paid by 3 the Treasurer of Howard County each month on presentation of an itemized voucher.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 5 35 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to 6 the salary or compensation of a judge or the Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court for 7 Howard County during a term of office beginning before the effective date of this Act, 8 but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of a judge or the 9 Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court for Howard County shall take effect at the 10 beginning of the next following term of office.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
October 1, 2013.
