A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Oyster Sanctuaries – Oyster Bar Cleaning and Removal of Diseased Oysters

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to allow a 4 person to catch oysters in an oyster sanctuary using certain equipment under $\mathbf{5}$ certain circumstances for the purpose of cleaning an oyster bar or removing diseased oysters; creating a certain exception under certain circumstances to 6 7 certain prohibitions against catching oysters in oyster sanctuaries; authorizing 8 the Department to establish a schedule for the cleaning of oyster bars and the 9 removal of diseased ovsters on ovster sanctuaries or portions of ovster 10 sanctuaries; authorizing the Department to adopt regulations establishing 11 standards and procedures to implement this Act; and generally relating to 12 ovster bar cleaning and the removal of diseased ovsters on ovster sanctuaries.

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 1 $\mathbf{2}$ MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article – Natural Resources 4 4 - 1014. (a) This section applies only to the waters of the State that lie contiguous to $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Somerset County in the Chesapeake Bay. There is an oyster sanctuary in Monie Bay known as the Webster ground 7(b) 8 that includes all the waters inshore of a line northeasterly from Long Point to a designated point in Monie Bay at latitude 38 degrees, 12 minutes, 37.8 seconds north, 9 longitude 75 degrees, 51 minutes, 51.0 seconds west, then southwesterly to the eastern 10 entrance to Pigeon House Creek. 11 12[A] SUBJECT TO § 4–1014.4 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A person may not (c) 13 catch oysters in the oyster sanctuary described in subsection (b) of this section or an ovster sanctuary that was established by regulations adopted by the Department. 14154-1014.1. 16 (a) This section applies only to the waters of the State that lie contiguous to 17Calvert County in the Chesapeake Bay. 2 **THE DEPARTMENT MAY:**

3 (1) AUTHORIZE A PERSON TO CATCH OYSTERS IN AN OYSTER
4 SANCTUARY BY HAND TONG OR, IF LAWFUL, POWER DREDGE FOR THE PURPOSE
5 OF CLEANING AN OYSTER BAR OR REMOVING DISEASED OYSTERS;

6 (2) ESTABLISH A SCHEDULE FOR THE CLEANING OF OYSTER BARS
 7 AND REMOVAL OF DISEASED OYSTERS ON OYSTER SANCTUARIES OR PORTIONS
 8 OF OYSTER SANCTUARIES; AND

9(3) ADOPT REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING STANDARDS AND10PROCEDURES TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

12 (f) In addition to any other applicable penalty set forth in this title, a person 13 who unlawfully takes oysters from a leased oyster bottom, an oyster sanctuary, an 14 oyster reserve, or an area closed to shellfish harvest by the Department of the 15 Environment, when the area is designated and marked by buoys or other signage or 16 the person knew or should have known that taking the oysters from the area was 17 unlawful, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$3,000.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 October 1, 2013.
