A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Mental Hygiene Administration – Psychiatric Bed Registry – Report

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Mental Hygiene Administration, in collaboration
 with the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems, to
 provide a certain report on a certain psychiatric bed registry to certain
 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally
 relating to a report on a certain psychiatric bed registry.
- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 9 MARYLAND, That:

10 (a) On or before December 1, 2013, the Mental Hygiene Administration, in 11 collaboration with the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems 12 (MIEMSS), shall report to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health and 13 Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 14 Government Article, on the progress of implementing and operating the psychiatric 15 bed registry developed by the Administration and MIEMSS.

- 16 (b) The progress report required under subsection (a) of this section shall 17 include:
- (1) information on the number of acute general hospitals, private
 psychiatric hospitals, and State facilities that are participating in the registry;
- 20 (2) the effect of the registry on placement of patients in psychiatric 21 beds;
- (3) information, based on usage of the registry, on the adequacy of the
 State's psychiatric bed capacity; and

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 June 1, 2013.
