CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study a Post–Labor Day Start Date for Maryland Public Schools

FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study a Post–Labor Day Start Date 4 $\mathbf{5}$ for Maryland Public Schools; providing for the membership, chair, and staff for 6 the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 7 compensation; authorizing a member of the Task Force to receive 8 reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study issues 9 relating to a post-Labor Day start date for Maryland public schools; requiring the Task Force to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before 10 a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating 11 to the Task Force to Study a Post-Labor Day Start Date for Maryland Public 1213 Schools.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (a) There is a Task Force to Study a Post-Labor Day Start Date for 17 Maryland Public Schools.

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1 (f) The Task Force shall study the impact of moving the start date of the 2 public school year in the State to after Labor Day on the following areas:

3 (1) the education system, including the academic calendar, planning,

- 6 (3) summer tourism.

(g) On or before June 30, 2014, the Task Force shall report its findings and
recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
Government Article, the General Assembly.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 12 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 13 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
