CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

$\mathbf{2}$ Commission on the Commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the Passage 3 of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on the Commemoration of the 100th $\mathbf{5}$ Anniversary of the Passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States 6 Constitution; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the 7 Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain 8 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 9 requiring the Commission to take certain actions and make recommendations 10 regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to report its activities, findings, and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 11 12 before a certain date and annually thereafter for a certain period of time; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 13 Commission on the Commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the Passage of 14the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution. 15

HOUSE BILL 1535

Preamble

WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution giving American women the right to vote was passed by both houses of the United States Congress in 1919; and

5 WHEREAS, Maryland's representatives Senator Joseph I. France and 6 Congressmen William Andrews, John Linthicum, and Frederick Zihlman voted in 7 favor of the resolution that sent the proposed amendment to the states; and

8 WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment was ratified by the State of Tennessee on 9 August 18, 1920, making it the 36th state to ratify the amendment and provided the 10 final ratification necessary to enact the amendment; and

11 WHEREAS, Maryland and its citizens played an important role in the cause of 12 suffrage for women, including serving as the final stretch of the 1913 March for 13 Women's Suffrage from Newark, New Jersey, to Washington, D.C.; and

14 WHEREAS, The years 2019 through 2020 will mark the 100th anniversary of 15 the passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution; now, therefore,

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 2 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE 3 BUDGET.

4 (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL:

5 (1) ASSEMBLE AN INVENTORY OF SITES IN MARYLAND THAT ARE 6 SIGNIFICANT TO THE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT AND THE RATIFICATION 7 OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION;

8 (2) DEVELOP A PLAN FOR COMMEMORATING THE EVENTS THAT 9 OCCURRED IN MARYLAND CONNECTED TO THE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT 10 AND THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES 11 CONSTITUTION;

12(3) DEVELOP A STRATEGY TO ENCOURAGE TOURISM RELATED TO13THE COMMEMORATION;

14(4) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING FACILITY15DEVELOPMENT AND REPAIR RELATED TO THE COMMEMORATION;

16 **(5)** COORDINATE WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LOCAL 17 GOVERNMENTS IN THE STATE, AND NEIGHBORING JURISDICTIONS REGARDING 18 THE DEVELOPMENT OF PLANS COMMEMORATING THE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE 19 MOVEMENT AND THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED 20 STATES CONSTITUTION; AND

(6) IF APPROPRIATE, RECEIVE TESTIMONY FROM AND CONSULT
 WITH INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE REGARDING THE ISSUES OF
 INTEREST TO THE COMMISSION.

(G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2014, AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER
FOR THE FOLLOWING 5 YEARS, THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS
ACTIVITIES, FINDINGS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN
ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE
GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and 4 months and, at the 31 end of October 31, 2020, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 32 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
