9	WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics, pursuant to a
10	complaint filed with the Joint Committee on April 10, 2012, conducted a thorough
11	review of the allegations of violations of the Maryland Public Ethics Law by Delegate
12	William "Tony" McConkey relating to legislative actions that would provide Delegate
13	McConkey with a direct and personal financial benefit; and
14	WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics submitted detailed
15	findings, adopted by unanimous vote of its members, in a Report dated February 4,
16	2013; and
17	WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics recommended in its
18	Report, with a majority of members concurring, that "[t]he Speaker of the House of
19	Delegates submit to the House of Delegates, and the full House of Delegates adopt, a
20	resolution of reprimand expressing the House of Delegates' disapproval of Delegate
21	McConkey's actions, based on his activities as set forth in this Report of the Joint
22	Committee on Legislative Ethics"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the House of Delegates of Maryland adopt the findings and conclusions contained in the Report issued on February 4, 2013, by the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics; and be it further

RESOLVED, That Delegate William "Tony" McConkey be reprimanded by the House of Delegates of Maryland, pursuant to Article III, Section 19 of the Maryland Constitution.
