A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Transportation Authority – Tolls – U.S. Route 15

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Transportation Authority to seek to 4 execute a memorandum of understanding with the Federal Highway $\mathbf{5}$ Administration stating that the Authority may collect tolls on U.S. Route 15 in 6 a certain manner and use the toll revenue to finance certain improvements to 7 U.S. Route 15; requiring the Authority to submit a report including certain 8 information to the Governor and the General Assembly if the Authority 9 determines that a memorandum of understanding that satisfies certain 10 requirements cannot be executed; requiring the Authority to implement a memorandum of understanding that satisfies certain requirements as soon as 11 12 practicable; and generally relating to the collection of tolls to finance certain improvements to U.S. Route 15. 13

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (A) THE AUTHORITY SHALL SEEK TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF 2 UNDERSTANDING WITH THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION STATING 3 THAT THE AUTHORITY MAY:

4 (1) COLLECT TOLLS ON U.S. ROUTE 15 AT A LOCATION NEAR THE 5 BOUNDARY BETWEEN MARYLAND AND PENNSYLVANIA; AND

- 6 (2) USE THE TOLL REVENUE COLLECTED ON U.S. ROUTE 15 TO 7 FINANCE THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:
- 8 (I) CONSTRUCTION OF AN INTERCHANGE AT U.S. ROUTE 9 15 AND MONOCACY BOULEVARD;
- 10(II)WIDENING OF U.S. ROUTE 15 TO THREE LANES IN EACH11DIRECTION THROUGH THE CITY OF FREDERICK; AND

12 (III) CONSTRUCTION OF INTERCHANGES, OVERPASSES, AND 13 UNDERPASSES TO ELIMINATE AT-GRADE INTERSECTIONS ON U.S. ROUTE 15 14 BETWEEN MONOCACY BOULEVARD AND THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN MARYLAND 15 AND PENNSYLVANIA.

16 (B) IF THE AUTHORITY DETERMINES, AFTER CONSULTATIONS WITH 17 THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION, THAT A MEMORANDUM OF 18 UNDERSTANDING THAT SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF 19 THIS SECTION CANNOT BE EXECUTED, THE AUTHORITY SHALL, IN ACCORDANCE 20 WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, SUBMIT A REPORT TO 21 THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WITHIN 15 DAYS THAT:

22(1) DESCRIBES THE SPECIFIC ISSUES THAT PREVENTED THE23AUTHORITY FROM EXECUTING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING THAT24SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION; AND

(2) PROVIDES ANY RECOMMENDATIONS THE AUTHORITY HAS
REGARDING HOW THE AUTHORITY CAN, TO THE GREATEST EXTENT FEASIBLE,
TAKE THOSE ACTIONS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (A)(1) AND (2) OF THIS
SECTION WHILE COMPLYING WITH FEDERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

29 (C) IF THE AUTHORITY EXECUTES A MEMORANDUM OF 30 UNDERSTANDING THAT SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF 31 THIS SECTION, THE AUTHORITY SHALL IMPLEMENT THE AGREEMENT AS SOON 32 AS PRACTICABLE.

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 34 June 1, 2013.

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
