3 FOR the purpose of altering the date by which the Aquaculture Coordinating Council
4 must make certain proposals and recommendations to the Governor and certain
5 legislative committees each year; and generally relating to the Aquaculture
6 Coordinating Council.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Natural Resources**

2 (a) There is an Aquaculture Coordinating Council.

3 (c) (1) The Coordinating Council shall:

4 (i) Formulate and make proposals to the Governor and, in
5 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Education,
6 Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Environmental Matters
7 Committee on or before [October 1] **JUNE 30** of each year for advancing Maryland
8 aquaculture, including recommendations for a fee structure on aquaculture operations
9 in order to reduce State expenditures on aquaculture programs;

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2013.
