Department of Aging – Aging and Disability Resource Center Program – Maryland Access Point

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Aging and Disability Resource Center Program in $\mathbf{5}$ the Department of Aging; providing that the Program is the State's Aging and 6 Disability Resource Center for purposes of the federal Older Americans Act; 7specifying the purpose of the Program; requiring the Department to administer, 8 supervise, and coordinate the Program with the cooperation of certain other 9 State agencies; requiring the Program to designate local Program offices and 10 provide certain services and materials; defining certain terms; and generally 11 relating to the Aging and Disability Resource Center Program.
