1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Election Law – Special Elections – Voting by Mail**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain provisions of law concerning voting by mail in
4 special elections; authorizing the Governor, a county council, or a board of
5 county commissioners to direct that voting by mail be utilized in certain special
6 elections; specifying the application of certain provisions of law to a special
7 election conducted by mail; requiring a local board of elections to mail a
8 vote-by-mail ballot to each registered voter who is eligible to vote in a special
9 election conducted by mail unless the voter has requested that the ballot be
10 transmitted by other means; specifying that a voter is not required to submit an
11 application to receive a vote-by-mail ballot; requiring a local board to send a
12 vote-by-mail ballot to each eligible voter at least a certain number of days
13 before the day of a special election; requiring that vote-by-mail ballots be
14 mailed to the address on file in the statewide voter registration list for each
15 eligible voter except in certain circumstances; requiring a local board to issue a
16 replacement vote-by-mail ballot to a voter under certain circumstances;
17 requiring each local board to establish at least one voting center for the use of
18 any eligible voter who chooses to cast a ballot in person in a special election;
19 specifying certain requirements for a voting center established by a local board;
20 authorizing a local board to establish a voting center during a certain time
21 period; providing that a certain process for applying in person for an absentee
22 ballot at the office of a local board does not apply to a special election conducted
23 by mail; providing that certain provisions of law relating to voting at a polling
24 place on election day also apply to voting at a voting center established under
25 this Act; requiring a voter to return a vote-by-mail ballot by certain methods;

2 Subtitle 5. [Montgomery County] Voting by Mail IN SPECIAL ELECTIONS.

4 (a) This subtitle applies only to a special election [for the Montgomery
5 County Council] that is not held concurrently with a regularly scheduled primary or
6 general election.

7 (b) Voting by mail may be utilized in a special election [for the Montgomery
8 County Council] in accordance with this subtitle.

9 (c) A SPECIAL ELECTION TO FILL A VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF
10 REPRESENTATIVE IN CONGRESS SHALL BE CONDUCTED BY MAIL IF THE
11 GOVERNOR’S PROCLAMATION ISSUED UNDER § 8–710 OF THIS ARTICLE
12 DIRECTS THAT THE ELECTION BE CONDUCTED BY MAIL.

12 the Tuesday preceding the day of a special election, if the voter's residence has
13 changed from the address that is on file in the statewide voter registration list to
14 another location within the State.

16 voter if the election director of the local board has reasonable grounds to believe that
17 the vote-by-mail ballot previously issued to the voter has been lost, destroyed, [or]
18 spoiled, OR NOT RECEIVED.

12 (a) A vote–by–mail ballot is considered timely and may be counted if the
13 ballot:

14 (1) is returned in person to the office of [the] A local board by the voter
15 or the voter’s duly authorized agent no later than 8 p.m. on the day of a special
16 election; or

17 (2) (i) is received by mail by [the] A local board no later than 10
18 a.m. on the second Friday after a special election; and

19 (ii) was mailed on or before election day, as verified:

20 1. by a postmark; or

21 2. if the return envelope does not contain a postmark or
22 the postmark is illegible, by the voter’s affidavit that the ballot was mailed on or
23 before election day.
