11 12	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15	(a) A person may not:
16 17 18	(1) [solicit] SOLICIT , advertise, or represent the person to the public as a tree expert, or assume to practice as a tree expert without having received a license; [or]
19 20	(2) [after] AFTER having received the license and subsequently losing it by revocation or suspension continue to practice as a tree expert; or
21 22	(3) [use] USE the title or abbreviation "L.T.E." or any other words, letters, or abbreviations tending to indicate that the person is a licensed tree expert or



- a tree expert without having received a license, or when the license has been revoked or suspended.
- 3 (b) A LICENSED TREE EXPERT MAY NOT SUPERVISE MORE THAN ONE 4 COMPANY THAT PROVIDES TREE EXPERT SERVICES.
- 5 **(C)** If the owner of a tree employs any person to engage in the practice of a "licensed tree expert" as provided in § 5–415 of this subtitle, the owner is not subject to this penalty.
- 8 **[(c)] (D)** A person may not advertise that the person can provide tree 9 services, including treatment, care, or removal of trees, unless the advertisement 10 includes:
- 11 (1) The license number of the licensed tree expert advertising tree 12 services in one of the following forms: "Licensed Tree Expert No.___" or "L.T.E. 13 No.___"; or
- 14 (2) A statement that all tree services are limited to trees 20 feet tall or 15 less.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
