# **SENATE BILL 237**

## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Health Occupations – Sunset Extension and Program Evaluation

- 3 FOR the purpose of continuing the State Acupuncture Board, the State Board of 4 Dietetic Practice, and the State Board of Occupational Therapy Practice in  $\mathbf{5}$ accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset 6 law) by extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the 7 statutory and regulatory authority of the boards; requiring that an evaluation of 8 certain boards and the statutes and regulations that relate to certain boards be 9 performed on or before a certain date; requiring the State Acupuncture Board and the State Board of Dietetic Practice to submit certain reports to certain 10 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; making 11 12technical changes; and generally relating to the State Acupuncture Board, the 13 State Board of Dietetic Practice, and the State Board of Occupational Therapy 14Practice.

Have satisfactorily completed academic requirements 1 (1)(i) 1.  $\mathbf{2}$ for the field of dietetics as approved by the Board; and 3 2.Have received a baccalaureate degree from a college or university accredited by an educational accrediting association recognized by the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Council on Higher Education and Accreditation; or 6 (ii) Have received a master's or doctoral degree from a college or 7university accredited by an educational accrediting association recognized by the Council on Higher Education and Accreditation in nutritional sciences (with emphasis 8 9 in human nutrition), food and nutrition, dietetics, human nutrition, community 10 nutrition, public health nutrition, or equivalent training approved by the Board; 11 Have satisfactorily completed a program of supervised clinical (2)12experience approved by the Board; and 13(3)Submit to the Board proof of certification by the (i) Certification Board for Nutritional Specialists; or 14 15Submit to the Board proof of registration with the (ii) Commission on Dietetic Registration of the [American Dietetic Association] 16 ACADEMY OF NUTRITION AND DIETETICS. 1718 5 - 305. 19(a)Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may waive an 20examination requirement of this title for an individual who: 21(1)Is licensed to practice dietetics in another state or country; Is registered to practice dietetics by the Commission on Dietetic 22(2)23Registration of the [American Dietetic Association] ACADEMY OF NUTRITION AND **DIETETICS**: or 2425(3)Is certified by the Certification Board for Nutrition Specialists. 26(b) The Board may grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant: 27Pays the application fee set by the Board under § 5-206 of this (1)28title; and 29(2)Provides adequate evidence that the applicant: 30 (i) Meets the qualifications otherwise required by this subtitle; 31 and

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1 (ii) 1. Became licensed in the other state or country after 2 passing, in that state or country, an examination that the Board determines to be 3 comparable to the examination for which the applicant is seeking the waiver;

2. Became registered by the Commission on Dietetic
Registration of the [American Dietetic Association] ACADEMY OF NUTRITION AND
DIETETICS after meeting the examination waiver requirements of that Commission
or its predecessor; or

8 3. Became certified by the Certification Board for 9 Nutrition Specialists after meeting the examination waiver requirements of that 10 Certification Board or its predecessor.

(a) On or before December 15 of the 2nd year before the evaluation date of a
 governmental activity or unit, the Legislative Policy Committee, based on a
 preliminary evaluation, may waive as unnecessary the evaluation required under this
 section.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (a) of this section, on or before the evaluation date for the following governmental activities or units, an evaluation shall be made of the following governmental activities or units and the statutes and regulations that relate to the governmental activities or units:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1,
2013, the State Acupuncture Board shall submit a report to the Senate Education,
Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government
Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article,
that:

8 (1) builds on the figures provided by the Board in its response to the 9 2012 Joint Chairmen's Report;

10 (2) addresses the options suggested by the Department of Legislative 11 Services in the 2012 Preliminary Evaluation of the State Acupuncture Board to keep 12 revenues and expenditures in balance; and

(3) includes any fee increases, changes to the executive director
 position, and any options for sharing additional resources or pooling funding with
 other boards and discusses how these changes would modify the Board's fund balance.

16 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 17 2013, the State Board of Dietetic Practice shall submit a report to the Senate 18 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and 19 Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 20 Government Article, that recommends any legislative changes to clarify the practice of 21 dietetics and any additional authority the Board needs to address complaints alleging 22 the unlicensed practice of dietetics.

23 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect24 July 1, 2013.
