1 AN ACT concerning

Administrative Procedure Act – Proposed Regulations – Public Hearings and Voting

FOR the purpose of requiring the Joint Committee on Administrative, Executive, and
Legislative Review to hold a public hearing regarding a proposed regulation
under certain circumstances; requiring the Committee, under certain
circumstances, to vote on whether to oppose the adoption of a certain regulation
under a certain provision of law; requiring that members of the Committee be
provided certain notice regarding the scheduling of a certain meeting; and
generally relating to public hearings and voting regarding proposed regulations.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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Article – State Government

20 (a) (1) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a unit may not 21 adopt a proposed regulation until:

(i) after submission of the proposed regulation to the
 Committee for preliminary review under § 10–110 of this subtitle; and

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(ii) at least 45 days after its first publication in the Register.

2 (2) (i) If the Committee determines that an appropriate review 3 cannot reasonably be conducted within 45 days and that an additional period of review 4 is required, it may delay the adoption of the regulation by so notifying the 5 promulgating unit and the Division of State Documents, in writing, prior to the 6 expiration of the 45-day period.

7 (ii) If notice is provided to the promulgating unit pursuant to 8 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the promulgating unit may not adopt the 9 regulation until it notifies the Committee, in writing, of its intention to adopt the 10 regulation and provides the Committee with a further period of review of the 11 regulation that terminates not earlier than the later of the following:

- 12 1. the 30th day following the notice provided by the 13 promulgating unit under this subparagraph; or
- 14 2. the 105th day following the initial publication of the15 regulation in the Register.
- 16 (3) The promulgating unit shall permit public comment for at least 30 17 days of the 45–day period under paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection.
- 18 (4) (I) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION 19 (B)(2)(II) OF THIS SECTION, IF AT LEAST 5 MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE 20 REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING ON A REGULATION, THE COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD 21 A PUBLIC HEARING.

22**(II)** 1. IF A PUBLIC HEARING IS HELD **UNDER** SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE COMMITTEE SHALL VOTE ON 2324WHETHER TO OPPOSE THE ADOPTION OF THE REGULATION UNDER § 10–111.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE AT THE HEARING OR AT A MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE 2526SUBSEQUENT TO THE HEARING.

- 27 **2.** IF A VOTE ON THE REGULATION IS NOT TAKEN AT 28 THE PUBLIC HEARING OR IMMEDIATELY THEREAFTER, THE COMMITTEE 29 MEMBERS SHALL BE PROVIDED AT LEAST 1 WEEK'S NOTICE OF THE 30 SCHEDULING OF ANY SUBSEQUENT MEETING TO VOTE ON THE REGULATION.
- 31 (b) (1) The unit may adopt a proposed regulation immediately if the unit:
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- (i) declares that the emergency adoption is necessary;

(ii) submits the proposed regulation to the Committee and the
 Department of Legislative Services, together with the fiscal impact statement required
 under subsection (c) of this section; and

If a vote on the emergency regulation is not taken at 18the public hearing or immediately thereafter, the Committee members shall be 19provided at least 1 week's notice of the scheduling of any subsequent meeting to vote on the regulation. 2021Unless the Governor declares that immediate adoption is (iv) 22necessary to protect the public health or safety, the Committee may not approve the 23emergency adoption of a regulation earlier than 10 business days after receipt of the 24regulation by the Committee and the Department of Legislative Services. 25If there is no request for a public hearing, the staff of the (3)26Committee may poll, in person, by telephone, or in writing: 27(i) the members of the Committee: or 28if staff of the Committee tries but is unable to contact a (ii) majority of the members of the Committee in a timely manner and immediate 2930 adoption is necessary to protect the public health or safety, the presiding Chairman or the cochair. 3132(4) (i) The Committee may impose, as part of its approval, any 33 condition.

$rac{6}{7}$	(5) The Committee may rescind its approval by a majority of its members present and voting at a public hearing or meeting of the Committee.
8 9	(c) (1) The fiscal impact statement, prepared by the unit and submitted under subsection (b) of this section, shall state:
10 11	(i) an estimate of the impact of the emergency regulation on the revenues and expenditures of the State;
12 13 14	(ii) whether the State budget for the fiscal year in which the regulation will become effective contains an appropriation of the funds necessary for the implementation of the emergency regulation;
$\begin{array}{c} 15\\ 16\end{array}$	(iii) if an appropriation is not contained in the State budget, the source of the funds necessary for the implementation of the emergency regulation; and
17 18	(iv) whether the emergency regulation imposes a mandate on a local government unit.
19 20	(2) If the emergency regulation imposes a mandate on a local government unit, the fiscal impact statement shall:

23 24 25 26	(ii) if the information may be practicably obtained given the emergency circumstances of the regulations, include an estimate of the impact of the emergency regulation on the revenues and expenditures of local government units; and
