2	Frederick County - Authority to Ban Synthetic Cannabinoids

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the County Commissioners of Frederick County to enact an ordinance that prohibits the knowing or intentional possession of 4 5 synthetic cannabinoids; prohibiting the sale or manufacture of synthetic 6 cannabinoids; making real property used in violation of the ordinance a 7 nuisance; providing for civil and criminal penalties for a violation of the 8 ordinance; defining a certain term; making this Act an emergency measure; 9 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to synthetic cannabinoids in Frederick County. 10

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
