# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Real Property – Use of Coercion, Threat, or Intimidation – Contracts Void

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from coercing, threatening, or intimidating a 3 property owner in a certain manner to induce that property owner to enter into 4  $\mathbf{5}$ a certain contract; establishing that a contract entered into in violation of this 6 Act is void; establishing that, if a person violates this Act, certain contracts 7 entered into for the same project are also void; authorizing a property owner to 8 bring a certain action in a certain circuit court; authorizing the court, if it finds 9 that a person has violated this Act, to award damages not exceeding a certain amount and order the person to pay certain costs and attorney's fees; defining a 10 certain term; providing for the application of this Act; providing that existing 11 12obligations or contract rights may not be impaired by this Act; and generally 13 relating to certain contracts entered into through coercion, threat, or intimidation. 14

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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## **Article - Real Property**

23 **10–711.** 



1 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "COERCE, THREATEN, OR INTIMIDATE" 2 MEANS TO COMPEL OR ATTEMPT TO COMPEL ANOTHER BY THREAT OF 3 CONDEMNATION OR OTHER ADVERSE CONSEQUENCES.

4 (2) "COERCE, THREATEN, OR INTIMIDATE" INCLUDES ANY 5 DISCUSSION OF CONDEMNATION OR OF INSTITUTING A CONDEMNATION 6 PROCEEDING AGAINST A PERSON'S PROPERTY.

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(B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A CONTRACT ENTERED INTO WITH:

8 (1) A PRIVATE COMPANY REGULATED UNDER THE NATURAL GAS 9 ACT; OR

10 (2) A PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, AS DEFINED IN § 1–101 OF THE 11 PUBLIC UTILITIES ARTICLE.

12(C) A PERSON MAY NOT COERCE, THREATEN, OR INTIMIDATE A13PROPERTY OWNER TO INDUCE THE PROPERTY OWNER TO ENTER INTO A14CONTRACT TO SELL PROPERTY OR GRANT AN EASEMENT ON A PROPERTY.

15 (D) A CONTRACT ENTERED INTO IN VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (C) OF 16 THIS SECTION IS VOID.

17 (E) IF A PERSON VIOLATES SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, ANY 18 OTHER CONTRACT FOR THE SALE OF PROPERTY OR FOR GRANTING AN 19 EASEMENT ON PROPERTY ENTERED INTO FOR THE SAME PROJECT AS THE 20 PROJECT FOR WHICH THE VOID CONTRACT WAS ENTERED INTO IS ALSO VOID.

(F) A PROPERTY OWNER THAT HAS ENTERED INTO A CONTRACT WITH A
 PERSON IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION MAY BRING AN ACTION TO VOID THE
 CONTRACT IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE PROPERTY
 IS LOCATED.

25 (G) IF THE COURT FINDS THAT A PERSON HAS VIOLATED SUBSECTION
26 (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE COURT MAY:

27(1)AWARD DAMAGES TO THE PROPERTY OWNER NOT EXCEEDING28THREE TIMES THE COMPENSATION OFFERED IN THE CONTRACT; AND

29(2)ORDER THE PERSON TO PAY ALL COURT COSTS AND30REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES OF THE PROPERTY OWNER.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a presently existing 32 obligation or contract right may not be impaired in any way by this Act.

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1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2013.
